When I think of the wasted years of "having fun," instead of meeting God at his appointed place, I am sick with shame. I'm trying to make restitution by urging other people to serve God.

FREEDOM TO CHOOSE--

(or, Men: the unfinished animal)

In all of the creating, only man was left "unfinished!" Man is the only creature left with the freedom to choose. The bird is born with the "knowhow" to build a nest in the summer and fly south in the winter. The beaver knows how to build his home with no training. The spider can spin a web that man cannot as yet duplicate. The bee can make the honeycomb and fill it with honey.

But when the bird has constructed its nest; when the beaver has built a home; when the spider has spun a web; and when the bee has made and filled its honeycomb, all are finished. That is all they can do. The bee cannot learn to build a wasp's nest, the bird cannot go beyond its inherient capacities with which it was born. But not so with man! God truly crowned his creation with the "unfinished animal"—MAN! Han cannot spin a webb

or make a honeycomb, yet he should feel no envy for the spider or bee. Being put into the world "unfinished," man is limited only by himself. In all of creation, only "unfinished man" is able to communicate with God.

In creating man, God has most fully revealed his nature to us. He wants our love and devotion, but he does not force it. We have the freedom to choose. He desires our obedience, but we must do it of our own free will. God is not willing that any should perish, but he forces no man to be saved. To force man to worship and serve him would defeat the purpose of his final act of creation. Men could have been made as the spider, with only an instinct to guide him, but God wants something more. He could have made us as robots, with no power to choose, but that is not his nature or purpose. Jesus said of the Father in John's gospel "for the Father seeketh such to worship him." Jn. 4:23 Paul exhorts Christians--"If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God!" (Col. 3:1) Man, the "unfinished" creature, can rise no higher than his goals in life. Therefore we must set higher standards than mortal man for excellence in the finished product. We must not judge ourselves by ourselves or we are no more than fools. The spider makes a webb like every other spider; the bird makes a nest like every other bird of its kind. But not so with God's "unfinished" creature. We may achieve things far beyond what our brother in the flesh may obtain simply due to the ideals in our life.

God has not left man to wander aimlessly in life. He has communicated his desires and communicated his

Even with a reasonable amount of intelligence, I cannot even build a nest that would pass the in

spection of a nearsighted robin, nor could I even begin to spin a webb that would even look like a spider's handiwork. I do not have a "builtin" instinct to go to a warmer climate in the winter. I do, however, have one instinct-that is to worship! All men do worship someone, or something. There are no exceptions. We have an "automatic pilot" that we call conscience. God did not, however, give us a pre-set conscience. Our conscience is trained by our environment as youth and by choice when we are older. As a child growing up in a denominational home I believed a person was "safe" as long as he or she was sincere. (Now that I am a Christian I do not believe anyone is safe.) I always heard-- "you must practice what you preach." That is true, and is also a principle taught in the Bible; but those I know were misusing this principle. It was not what a person believed that was right or wrong, but whether you were willing to follow what you believed. It was the practice, not the belief, that made one right or wrong.

Let us not fall short of our potential as a child of God. It is up to you to finish the "unfinished animal". No other creature has this great opportunity. Let me leave these inspired words to clearly reveal to you your purpose. "He hath shewed thee, o man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" Micah 6:3

There have now been sixteen responses to the gospel since that time. (Three of these were at camp this summer.) Twelve of these have resulted in an increase in the Lord's church. Four were for rededication; three locally.

Angles have been made to rejoice in heaven, as well as saints in the local church.

All of these have taken place since our spring meeting with brother Meadows. In that series of sermons we had him to emphasize personal evangelism. In the time that has passed many studies have been conducted in private homes. Several have been united with their Lord in baptism.

Others have expressed the desire to worship with the church here by the New Testament pattern. The Word of Gcd is still quick and powerful and sharper than a two-edged sword. We can see why Paul wrote "I have planted, Apollos watered; but God gave the increase." 1Cor. 3:6. In verse 8 he continued—"Now he planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall receive his own reward according to his own labour."

This verse put the emphasis of responsibility exactly where it should be—upon every Christian! But even as was declared to Solomon: "The half has never yet been told!" We have only begun to fight the good fight of faith! We have not yet striven against sin unto blood. People mistakenly say they can't do everything so they do not do anything. This is a very unrealistic attitude, and more important—it is fatal to the spiritual man!

God has never expected the impossible from his own. Name me one instance where God did not respond to the need of his servants! Give me one

example where God has ever failed to keep his end of the bargin. God provided Aaron to help Moses. There are a lot of Aarons in the church today. You do not need to hesitate because you feel you are inadequate to conduct a study in someone's home. Let it be known that you have a study you can set up and you will find those who are willing to help you.

Much good has been done in recent months. Much more good is yet to be done. YOU and I must do it with our talent or lack of talent. If you lack talent look for an Aaron.

THE LANGUAGE OF ASHDOD

In the New Testament we find a continual emphasis on pure and wholesome words. We are told to "hold fast the form of sound words". 2Tim. 1:13. We are told to speak the things which become sound doctrine. Sirply stated—we are to call Bible things by Bible names!

In the writing of Mehemiah we find children who were the result of mixed marriages. The Jews had taken strange wives. The children seemed to speak a language that was a mixture of the two languages. They were the offsprings of marriages expressly forbidden by the Law. One of the main missions of the Jewish nation was to be a sanctified, or separate, people unto God. But the result of the marriages was a mongrel race speaking a corrupt language. They were neither "fish nor fowl".

They were on the downward course that had been taken by Solomon, king of Israel during her greatest gory, which had taken him to sin and sorrow.

In our present day we find the problem of the "language of Ashdod". Although there is no such thing as "mixed marriages" on account of nationalities, (Gal. 3:28) we find many words and phrases creeping into our own language that is questionable in nature. There are so many things that we hear today that I will not exhaust the list in this article.

One of the questions I was asked by a teacher at school was: "Are you building in front of the senctuary?" Naybe this isn't so strange since I received a bulletin which stated that the chorus would sing in the sanctuary on Sunday evening. This bulletin was from "one of our own," not from a denomination! I suppose this referred to the room of the building where the public assembly is normally held, but I am not sure. I have been in the building, but failed to see the "sanctuary". I hope I am not being overly critical, but we profess to "call Bible things by Bible names!"

People talk about "joining the church", but I fail to read of non-Christians "joing the church". I believe a person can join the church only if he or she is already a Christian. Here, I am using the word "church" as a local assembly. Acts 9:26 states the apostle Paul (Saul) tried to join the church (disciples,) but the Christians were afraid of him. Fut a person who is not a Christian must be added to the church by the Lord. A non-Christian may come to the meetings, but that does not make him a member of the church. To the peron observing the assembly, he may appear to be a member, but sugar and salt look the same too. You can tell one from the other by what they do.

Some people refer to gospel preachers as "church of Christ preachers," and to members as "church of Christ members". This is the language of Ashdod". We should speak of gospel preachers evangelists, ministers, (with a small "") Christians, brethren, sisters, etc. (Let us be careful ve to

not make "Brother" a title.) We may speak of ourselves as members of the church, because the Bible speaks of the church as her members.

People today, as in the past, do not bother to find out if something is in the Bible or not, or if it is used in the same way. For example, the word "pastor" is used interchangably in the religious world to speak of the preacher, minister, etc. Many do not know that the words "pastor", "bishop", "elder," "presbyter", "overseer" are all used to . refer to the same office, but not to the preacher or evangelist. The preacher may be an elder, but not always. An elder or bishop does not have to be a

preacher; only a teacher. We hear people today speaking of "baptism" of infants when they do not mean baptism at all, but. sprinkling. Unfortunately, people seem to use the dictionary rather than the Bible to find out what the word "baptize" means. Only a good dictionary is 'safe" to use to find the meaning of words. Their design is not to give the meaning so much, but how they are now used in our language. A good dictionary defines "taptize" -- To dip or immerse in water . in a baptismal ceremony. But the same dictionary gives the following definition of "baptism". "A Christian sacrament of spiritual rebirth by which the recipient is cleansed of orginal sin through the symbolic application of water," One definition is correct according to the Bible, the other incorrect. The only way we can know which is true is to "search the Scriptures".

We must avoid teaching, by word or deed, anything that is not found in the Bible. We are all entitled to our opinions in instances where God has not specifically spoken, but where God has spoken we have no liberty of so-called "interpretation". Let each of us strive to avoid the "language of

Ashdod".

PPAYING OVER THE PLATE

In a very short verse Paul tells us to: "Pray without ceasing". I Thes. 5:17. In another verse he wrote: "Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away". 2Tim. 3:15.

Partially, at least, I base my "opinions" on praying in public upon these two verses, and teachings of the Lord. By "pudlic prayers" I refer in general to praying in restaurants while alone; or in cafeterias of any type where a Christian goes to eat when all are not starting at the same time, and where a general public prayer is not offered. I believe we always ought to give thanks for all things al ways; but I believe that praying in restaurants or school lunch rooms is ostentatious (that is, a pretentious display or showiness) prayer. Jesus spoke of those who "made their prayers in public to be seen of men".

If I am eating alone in a restaurant or lunch room I do not offer prayer after the food is in front of me. If the life I live does not constantly remind people that I am a Christian, then going in to a prayerful trance over a lunch tray or plate will hardly convince them either.

I know people who slander, gossip, backbite and tell questionable stories, etc., (you know the type) who make a"big thing"of their "prayer over their plate". If our godliness is shown for the day over a tray or plate of food it will not be sufficient to get us to heaven. As far as I know, there is no reason why a person cannot pray with eyes open and face straight ahead. We can gray while waiting for the food to be served or while walking to the table with it.

I surely do not want to belittle the importence of prayer, but if private prayer is cheapened by public displays, then I do not believe we are in the attitude of "praying without ceasing". People who do this are drawing attention to their outward religion. If our prayer life is done to be seen of ren then when we have been seen we have our reward. We are to "let our requests be made known unto God"; instead we are often saying to men; "Look how religious I am"! This is coming pretty close to "having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof". Jesus taught that our private prayers were to be done in secrecy. It is to be a "going into our closets" instead of a public display like the washing of hands before we eat. Read Mt. 15:1-9. Again, in my opinion, we need not feel the need of"prayer over a plate" to have a meaningful prayer life; if so then perhaps we need to "examine ourselves whether we be in the faith". 2Cor. 13:5-a)

This is not written to force my opinions on you, but to get you to think. Prayer is a privilege, but I do not feel we need to prove our love to God" by praying over a plate. I do not kiss my wife in public to prove I love her. People who have to kiss and lollygag around in public to

"prove their marriage" have a very shaky marriage. The married couple who spend much time kissing in public may soon be kissing goodby! If your wife or husband doesn't know you love them without you kissing them in public, then your kissing them in public is ostentatious and hypocritical!

Jesus said: "Let your light shine before, that they may see your good works, and glorify your. Father which is in heaven. I do not list my prayer to God through Christ among the "good works" of my life. Do YOU??????

GOD HAS NO GRANDCHILDREN

The parellel between the human family and man's spiritual relationship to God is limited to the first generation only. A man is God's son, or he is no kin whatever. There are no second or third generation descendants.

In respect of physical kinship, this may sound a little confusing, but it keeps one's spiritual pedigree very simple indeed. For as a Christian, your family tree is never longer than two generations: God and You!
