BEYOND OUR DUTY--

Much is said about Christian duty. What is it? How far does it go and where does it stop?

I often feel that the only reason many people function is merely because of duty. Were it not for a feeling of absolute necessity there would not be a second thought about giving, Bible study, attendance, teaching, personal work, etc,

Oddly enough, some can salve an aching conscience by checking in for Sunday morning worship, while such repair is more complicated with others.

Robot-like action plagues the Lord's church. Consider personal work as an example. No doubt programs of personal work do much good, and organization is important. However, the idea that personal work can be done only on a specified night each month, and only on an organized basis is preposterous and dangerous. No matter what the need, some will not visit unless it is "their night" Obligation is turned on for one night, and with its passing, duty is signed, sealed and delivered for another thirty days. When another month rolls around, the personal work button is pushed, and function is based on pure necessity.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus talked of going the second mile (Matthew 5:41). With the Jew, compulsion to go a mile with a Roman to carry baggage was degal duty at any time. However, Christ urged that one is not to be as concerned about absolute duty as he is Christian service.

The man who is always crying, "I've done my part" pr
"I've done my duty" will be of little value to the
church. A christian is always anxious to do more!

He wants to do ALL HE CAN DO, no matter how much or how little others are doing.

Christianity is always a "more than others" religion.

WHEN WE GO THEY COME!!

Ira North is minister of the Madison Church in Nashville with a record Sunday school attendance of 6,183.

With consistent visitation program your Sunday morning Bible school cannot fail to grow; without it you cannot succeed!

It is just that simple. To grow in Sunday school attendance you should:

- 1. Visit every absentee every week.
- 2. Visit all newcomers that enroll the week they enroll.
- 3. Visit every week the visitor that he comes to class.

A church in a new community had 100 in Sunday school. They made a vow to visit every visitor, every newcomer, and every absentee. They met on Monday eve. at 7 o'clock and had a short meeting in which they prayed, passed out the cards of the visitors, newcomers, and absentees of the day before (Sunday) and then went out to visit. Result - they went from 100 to 700 in three years. You may not acheive this phenomenal percentage, but brother you'll be surprised at the result if you keep it up consistently, completely and thoroughly for three years. WHEN WE GO THEY COME!

It is the responsibility of every Christian to visit. Another can no more do your visiting than he can do your praying, your Bible reading, or your giving. Those on the left hand at the judgment bar of God shall receive the ringing condemnation -"...Ye visited me not."

The old idea that we can erect a building and thereby berelieved of the responsibility of visiting is just plain unscriptural and anti-scriptual. We cannot take the attitude: "Here is the building - come and least a stay away and be dammed - just suit yourself." True, none of us would make such a statement. Yet in actual practice is this not what we are doing? After all, it is what we do that counts, not what we say.

The great commission still says GO (Mark 16:15-16) We can never obey this divine command by staying. We need to go across the sea, and we also need to go across the street. Every Christian must be a going Christian.

HARD TO ARGUE WITH THE FACTS. Every excuse can be given for not having a dynamic, active visitation program. However, these excuses will not take the place of visitation. It is hard to argue with the cold facts. And the cold truth is simply this: congregations with active visitation programs grow. You go and they come - this has been the universal experience of congregations whose members visit.

The GOOD SAMARITAN. In Luke, the 10th chapter, we have one of the world's most famous short stories. It is a Literary gem. But to those of us who really believe the Bible, it is more than a literary masterpiece. It is the Word of God. Jesus tells the story of a man who falls among thieves and is robbed and beaten. The priest and the Levite passed by on the other side. Their attitue was something like this: "Poor fellow, too bad. But I did not rob him. I did not beat him. He is no concern of mine."

How easy for us to be a 20th century Parisee. Mr. Jones has missed Sunday morning Bible school—so what? With this attitude it might be said of us: "You are in the same boat with the priest and the Levite."

THE CASE OF CAIN. The story of Cain is another case in point. When God asked Cain about his brother Able he gave this famous reply: "Am I my brother's keeper?" In other words, is it any business of mine? Do I have a responsibility to look after my brother? To the believer, this case alone should settle for all time the attitude we take concerning a brother. Yes, we have a responsibility. It is our business. We must take it seriously! Our own soul in reality is at stake! (Continued in next weeks bulletin)

Benjamin Franklin returned the manuscript with this appendage: "Burn it: never unchain that tiger: if the world is so bad with Jesus Christ, what would it be without him?"

This affords an unanswerable argument to the people who are opposers of Jesus Christ.

WHEN WE GO THEY COME!! (Continued form last weeks)

AN EXAMPLE. A few years ago a Christian, who we shall call Mr. Brown, quit the church. He lost interest. He did not mean to desert the Lord's army. Yet he did. He was overtaken in a fault. Another Christian in that same congregation was not overtaken. We shall call him Mr. Jones. Mr. Jones visited Mr. Brown periodically for many months. Sometimes he would just stay a couple of minutes. Before he left he would say: "We miss you. We need you. We want you to come back."

After a few months Mr. Brown did return and was restored to his first love. Today he is an elder in the church. His family is respected. He is serving God faithfully and is loved by the entire community. He is bringing forth fruit a hundred-fold. Yet, he gives credit to Mr. Jones. Of him he says: "He kept the thread of faith alive in my heart. His sincere concern brought me back to the fold." This is an actual case. Only the names have been changed.

7 OUT OF 10 LOST. The other day the author read these figures: "Seven out of ten children in the Bible Schools are lost to the church by the time they are 18." In churches of Christ the figure is estimated to be 5 out of 10. Each soul is worth more than the world. Tet, how many thousands slip away without a single visit. This is not only tragic, but sinful acquired.

PAUL S TESTRUCTION. In Gal. 6:1 Paul gives this instruction: "Enothran, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye thick are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meckness; considering thy self, lest the also be tempted."

Suppose I should come into your home and have a real at your table. Suppose further that you had a precious and beautiful little three year old girl named Susie. Three years later I visited your home again. At the dinner table I remarked: "Where is

Susie?" To this I hear you reply: "I don't know for sure. I saw her about six months ago. Mother, where is Susie?" "I haven't seen her this year," retorts mother. What am I to conclude? There is just one conclusion to reach. You just aren't concerned about Susie and her welfare, regardless of what you say.

Yet in the family of Christ we commit this same sin so often. An evangelist comes to the local congregation and twenty souls are converted. Next year someone asks about one of them. Faithful members look at one another and remark: "I saw her about six months ago." "I don't even know her." The Lord must conclude that we just are not concerned about our fellow-members welfare regardless of what we say.

EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS IS NOBODY'S. The job of visitation will never be accomplished until there is a specific plan. The hit-or-miss system just doesn't work-it is always too little and too late. Unless there are definite, specific, concrete assignments, it is the old story-what is everyone's business is nobody's. The job is not done.

"Gentlemen, after all, this business of succeeding narrows down to one thing...just one thing...seeing the people! Show me any man of ordinary ability who will go out and earnestly tell his story to four or five people very day, and I will show you a man who just can't help making good!" (Article by W. R. Bumpas entitled "Leading Adults to Visit.")

THERE IS NO SHORT CUT. There is no short cut. There is no gimmick. There is no scheme that will take the place of visitation. We can hardly imagine Jesus in any other picture than out in the highways and byways standing at the door and knocking. "Behold, I stand at the door and knock."

Encourage your local congregation to select the most capable and energetic among its number to lead your visitation program. A good leader is essential. Give the work your support. Remember, it is persistence that gets the job done. Stay with it. Remember there are three good rules for a growing Bible school. Rule 1 - Visit. Rule 2 - Visit. Rule 3 - Visit.

But what I really wonder today is how many of us are willing to do those things that prevent diverce. Of course, the very first thing is a sound teaching program in the home. Our children must be taught God's plan for them and His laws concerning marriage. (II Tim. 2:2). In addition they must witness marriages that work, that are happy, that are God centered!

How many of us have the opportunity to witness the first haltering steps toward breakup and not recognize it or lamore it. The first step is when a young married couple fall away from the church, become very irregular in attendance and do no work for Christ. This very definitely points out that their thoughts are turning inward, they are becoming selfish. No marriage can be successful when one or both think of self only or to the greatest extent. Many of us witness this beginning ad do nothing to prevent it. How many have witnessed : acts that demonstrate a lack of love in a couple. How often it is that young girls do not know how to cook; how to keep a clean house; how to tend a baby; or how to love their husband or children and the older women do nothing to help. Then we all shake our heads when divorce comes and say "I saw it coming". Why don't we try to prevent it? How often do we see young men insist on their night out, or weekly recreation, or what not when they leave their wives for extended times and the older men do nothing. Then when the macriage goes by the boards say "wisely," "I saw it coming". 

"Let us conduct ourselves properly, as people who live in the light of day; no orgies or drunkenness, no immorality or indecency, no fighting or jealousy."

From the above passage and many like it, we le learn that jealousy is something that God does not want his children to have, Jealousy has caused or expressed itself in murder and violence from the time of Cain on, and continues to be a majory problem in the world today. We would suggest that a lion's portion of the problems that come up in the Church today are as a direct result of childishness. A child is jealous when another child has a new or pretty toy. Many people in and out of the Church ... today have not done what Paul said he had done: "When I was a child I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man I put aw away childish things." I Cor. 14-20- see also I Pet. 2:2) Many people today are so selfish and childish that they can't stand for a preacher, elder, or a Christian of any type-especially a teenager, to receive any praise of any kind. This kind of jealousy is condemned by God. and is a result of a man or woman who simply has not grown up.

When you get might down to it, it is the failure of adults to grow up that causes most of the things that we find recognant. Pauting, uncooperative, retiring adults are found everywhere. Their hypocrisy and their lack of involment betrays their basic nature and their basic weekness - a rejection of the Bible and its teaching, and a failure to mature to the point where they can do God's will - rather than just play at Church. We as teenagers need to profit from this pathetic example and gear our lives so that we will be outgoing, mature soldiers for Christ.
