WORTHY OF CONSIDERATION

Before the service speak to God;
During the services, let God speak to you;
After the services, speak to each other.

"For re to live is Christ, and to die is gain (Phil, 1:21) This statement by Paul is hard for some to understand, especially for those who try to reca between the lines or read something into it that isn't there. All sorts of things are presumed, like Christ is spiritual, therefore our spiritual life is Christ and our fleshly life isn't involved. Just before the quoted verse Paul said "According to my earnest expectation and my hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but that with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ shall be magnified in my body, whether it be by life, or by death". (Phil. 1:20) Paul understands the essence of Christianity. It is in living Christ. Whether in life or death, Christ would be magnified. If only some way, whether by written or spoken word, we could cause men to recognize this great principle today, we wouldn't have to plead for any aspect of Christianity to be accomplished! And one thing is for certain, we couldn't keep buildings built fast enough to hold those that would turn to Christ from such an example.

"Whatscever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by Him." (Col. 3:17) This confirms that living, every aspect of living, is for Christ to magnify and glorify His name. Not just three times a week only, or Tuesday night or Saturday morning, but every minute of every day must be lived for Christ. Now how is that accomplished? By examining each word, action and thought and insure that they are for Christ and His glory. By recognizing that the reason we live is Christ because He is the difference between life and existance. And by rearranging all our ambitions, goals, hopes and achieverents into an alignment that is Christ and eventually heaven.

PERSONAL WORK

A critic once told Charles Alexander, "I don't like the way you do personal work." Alexander, a well-known preacher, replied, "Neither do I. Tell me, how do you do it?" Rather ashamed that he had brought the subject up, the critic admitted that he didn't do much of it. Then Alexander observed, "I still like the way I do it better than the way you don't."

Mothed is not the greatest problem we face in doing personal work. A far greater problem is our timidity. We use as our excuse the fact we don't have much confidence in our ability or our method. However, if the truth were known, our "hangup" is that we are so afraid of "offending sinners." that we would rather see them be lost than to make them mad at us. Now that's putting it rather bluntly, but it is the truth nonetheless.

Personal work is not so difficult. All a person needs is a little common sense, a knowledge of God's will, and a determination to do all he can to save souls. Training in personal work so that you might develop a good method is to be desired but do not let your lack of "polish" stop you. There is no possibility of saving the sinner you do not approach with the truth.

Wouldn't it be grand if all Christians had such concern for the lost that they could say with the poet: "Lord say some soul upon my heart, And love that soul through mt;

And may I nobly do my part,
To win that soul for thee." -Sel.

GOD'S PROMISE

God has not promised skies always blue, Flower-strewn pathways all our lives through. God has not promised sun without rain, Joy without sorrow, peace without pain.

But God has promised strength for the day, Rest for the labour, light for the way, Grace for the trials, help from above, Unfailing sympathy, undying love.

GOD'S POWERFUL WORD

The writer of Hebrews shows the great power of God's word by comparing the word to a two adject sword. "For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart." (4:12) Sadly, few men are aware of the trememdous power of the word of God.

Several years ago I heard a preacher of the gospel (he was also a chemistry teacher) describing the power of God's Word. He related how that a certain professor of chemistry had spoken to a group of chemist, of which he was a part. The incident took place a few years after World Wor II, when people were still frightened at the thought of the atomic and and hydrogen bomb. The professor posed a question to the group. The question was, "What is the most powerful thing on earth? Naturally, the men's mind turned to the nuclear bomb. But the professor replied, "The most powerful thing on earth is not the atomic or hydrogen bomb. The powerful thing on earth is the word of God." This is so true, but how many are aware of it?

The word of God is powerful in warning. Paul wrote the Thessalonians, "The Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven with his mighty angels, in flaming fire taking vengance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ." (II Thess. 1:7-8) Revelation 21:8 sets forth the in pending doom of the wicked. "But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and word word on the word of the wicked." But the fearful, and unbelieving, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone; which is the second death."

God's word is powerful in promise. When Paul was about to be separated from the Ephesian elders he said, "And now, brethren, I commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among all them which are sanctified." (Acts 20:32) The words of Jesus set forth a great promise in Matt. 11:28-30. "Come unto me,

all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart; and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

God's word is powerful as a standard by which men will be judged. In John 12:48 Jesus tells us, "He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him; the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day." An other passage which reveals the word of God as the basis of acceptance and rejection is II John 9. "Whoseever transgresseth, and abideth not in the doctrine of Christ, hath not God. He that abideth in the doctrine of Christ, he hath both the Father and the Son."

God's word is powerful in endurance. Jesus said, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but ry words shall not pass away." (Natt. 24:35)

In view of the power of the word of God it is a tragic thing to ignore it or set it aside. In a time when the world is filled with wickedness, when there is turnoil and frustration on every hand, the only source of true hope is the all powerful word of God. People who are living a life of fleshly indulgence and enjoying the pleasures of sin for a season are passing up the greatest reward that can come from man's existence, eternal life in hthe world to come. They are passing it by because they are rejecting God's powerful word.

COME DOWN AND WE WILL BELIEVE"

These soldiers who stood at the foct of the cross uttering their cyy were sensationalists. In their eyes, Jesus could vindicate his claim on Messiahship only by the doing of the stupendous and the collosal. They were a sking to see, not the picture of silent self-denial and sacrifice, obeying the will of God, but something as dramatic as loosening his hands and feet and stepping down from the cross. And when he did not do it, the whole incident became so boring that the soldiers sat down and cast lots for his garments. There, within a stone's throw of them, the greatest drama ever enacted was in progress. Yet, they were completely unaware of it because they were looking for the sensational.

Today on every hand, people are trying to find G od in the spectacular and dramatic. To them, the test of every sermon is not "Is it true?" but "Does it sweep me across the whole key-board of human emotion, leaving me perched on a mountain-type high?" The test of revelation is not "Did it come from the Book?" for that is ever so undramatic; but, "Did it come by vision or by dream?" Similarly, the test of one's spirituality is judged, not by his devotion to God or his service to man, but by his amazing ability to feel overwhelmed by the Holy Spirit, while speaking in an ecatatic tongue.

People who try to find God in the spectacular and dramatic, are often likely to miss God for the very reason that there is a sense in which no one is as unsensational as God. Naaman, the leper, wanted God to cure him of his dread disease in a dramatic, spectacular way. God told him to go dip seven times in the muddy Jordan. How undramatic! Net, he found healing. Jesus care to Matthew who was sitting at the seat of customs and said, "Follow me." It was undramatic, but Matthew, by obeying the command became a faith ful disciple and appstle.

So many are missing Christ because they are expecting religion to be dramatic. They are looking for a "sign" which Jesus said was the mark of an evil and adulterous generation (Matthew 27:42) Such need to hear the statement of Abraham to the rich man in Hades: "If they heed not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if one rise from the dead"(Luke 16:31). Salvation is not sensational. Faith is not all emotion. You can sitin its very shadow, as did the soldiers, and still miss the meaning. —Harry Gipson

BEST WAY TO SET RID OF A BAD HABIT IS TO

DROP ITS

HIMILITY

As has been so often stated, humility is a crowning virtue of the Christian. It is probably the one single trait which should characterize the life of the Christian more than any other. Humility was practiced by Christ and is emphasized in numerous instances in the New Testament. But in spite of the need for humility in our lives it is often lacking.

The importance of humility is set forth by Christ when his disciples asked him, "Who is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven?" In his reply he called a little , child wnto him and set him in their midst. Then he said, "Verily I say unto you, except ve be converted, and become as little children, ye shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. Whosocver therefore shall humble himself as this little child, the 73 same is "greatest in the kingdom of heave." Matt. 18:1-4) In Luke 18:9-14, Christ pictures humility in action --as he spoke a parable unto some self-righteous people. The Pharisee is shown as a boastful proud individual who looked down upon others. But the publican, aware of his unworthy condition, smote his breast saying. "God be merciful to me a sinner." Christ said the publican was justified rather than the Pharisee, and then adds, "For every one that exalteth hirself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted."

Christ also practiced humility to the greatest degree. He demonstrated the ultimate in himility when when he left his former place with God and took upon himself, the form of a servant, in the likeness of men, and "Humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross." (Phil. 2:6-7) Another humbling act of Jesus was that of washing the disciples feet, with the admonition, "If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet." (John 12:14) The washing of feet was never intended as an act of worship but it was a good way to show one's humility by stooping to the lowly task of a servant.

The apostle Faul was guarding against the lack of humility when he exhorted the Romans not to think of

themselves more highly than they ought to think. (Rom. 12:3) Paul warns the Galatians (5:26) when he said, "With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love." (Eph. 4:2) Paul even recognized the danger of his lack of humility as a result of the abundance of revelations he had received. This is revealed in what he wrote the Corinthians, as recorded in 2Cor. 12:7. "And lest I should be exalted above measure through the abundance of the revelations, there was given to me a thorm in the flesh, the messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I should be exalted above measure."

In James 4, the writer remins us that "God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace to the humble." (v.6) He also says "humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up." (v. 10)

A solution to our lack of humility was well expressed by a speaker a shorttime ago when he suggested "We need to pray to God to help us recognize who we are. The most of us would not have to pray for humility." That thought gives us something to think about. After all, who are we? What reason do whe have to be proud? Why should we think of ourselves more highly than others think of us? At the very best we still fall short of the glory of God, we are unworthy servants.

Although there are few of us within the body of Christ who are ashumble as we should be, those of us who preach are probably as lacking as my other group. There is a tendency to exalt one's self rather than Christ and his gospel. The attitude expressed by a classmate of mine about twenty years ago appears to be shared by others. The young man, who was planning to preach, suggested that when he got through school he was going to "really put his name before the people." He must not have been very successful in his ambition as I can't remember hearing of him since our school days. But the sad thing about it was that his attitude was totally laking in hemility.

Regardless of our place in the body of Christ we have no right to be "desirous of vain glory." We have no room to be proud. If we would be in God's sight we must humble ourselves. Therefore, when we tend to be proud and exalt ourselves we should ask God to help
