A WORD OF THANKS

According to you?

William McPherson had a charge of dynamite go off in his face. He lost his eyes and hands and the feeling in parts of his face. He realized how much the Bible meant to him and he needed its strength greatly. He could not read it in Braille because of his artificial hands. He tried to place his lips on the dots but they were numb. He found he could use his tongue to decipher the Moon Type system of dashes. The metal left his lips and tongue bleeding and very sore but he prayed to God to help him to continue to learn just one letter of the alphabet. In the 65 years that followed he read the Bible through 4 times with his tongue.

Would I study the Bible if the same thing happened to me that happened to Wr. McPherson? Would I have the desire, the intense desire to know God's will that I would go through what he did to learn? I wonder if I would not rather have dedided, "I can't ever read the Bible again,"

Would I study the Bible if I had to get up an hour earlier each day to work it into my busy(?)schedule? Or miss my favorite TV program if, at that hour, I remembered I hadn't studied my Bible for the day and wouldn't have time afterwards?

Would I study the Bible (I wish I hadn't heard of that MCPherser fellow) if I didn't feel just right or if I had had a hard day at work or if I was just too tired? (I wonder how that fellow learned to read with his tongue?) Or would I study even though I was a slow reader and it took me all day just to read one or two chapters?

Would I study the Bible on occasions when the saints were assembled (Sunday Morning, Wednesday night and etc.) if I had to without supper till after services or walk or drive 4 long distance to get there?

How many "Ifs" keep you from studying the Bible? Is it a matter of no importance to you at all? If it is, then do something about it. That McPherson fellow-- I guess his example will haunt me the rest of my life.

Progress Report on the New Addition
Dean Hoggatt

At the men's business meeting on April 12th, a progress report was made on the new classroom addition. As much as we had hoped to keep within the proposed cost figure of \$60,000., we were not going to be able. The costs to that date were near \$57,700., and there were some major costs yet to be covered. The carpeting, folding partitions, classroom equipment besides the outside brickwork and parking area and concrete sidewalks were all to be done if we were to have a finished project. An estimated cost figure of approx. \$14,000. will be needed to finish it. All the men present felt that we should increase our loan by this amount in order complete the new addition. We believe that this is a wise decision.

The new addition gives us an additional 4600 plus sq. ft of classroom (more than all the rest of the building combined). At a time when building costs are so high (\$28./sq. ft. and up, for contract jobs) our cost will be approx. \$16. sq. ft. I'm grateful for the good faith of the brethren here in rising to the need and not putting it off.

I am thankful too, that when in our day the world is lost in sin, that we intend to do something about it. Nearly everyone I've talked to knows about our expansion and we are in so favorable position to let the community know that we care. As we now assess all the advantages we have, let's dig in for the future. Our physical facilities, the preachers home in connection, a dedicated family as the Herron's to work with us, and especially the fine spirit and zeal of the congregation to work, the Lord's Kingdom is bound to grow as it has never grown before.

By July 1, we should have a budget figure for the 2nd half of the year. It appears now that a weekly contribution of approx. \$750. is needed. Working together, with faith in God, we can do this.

ON CHURCH ROLLS

If your name is on the church roll, but you are not attending services, you are no better off than you would be if your name should be removed. The name on church roll is not nearly as important as your presence when the saints meet to worship.

If you have been neglecting the worship services, for your own salvation, we urge you to come back to the place where you belong, and revive your souls so that you will be saved.

A R ASON FOR MARRIAGE FAILURE

In our day of rapid fire change, almost nothing is considered sacred--not even the time honored relationship of marriage. Marriage failure is approaching 75% in some parts of the country according to the Jan. 24 "Today" program on MBC*TV. Tom Brokaw interviewed Dr. Mavis Heathering and Dr. Mel Roman on the increasing failures in marriage. They pointed out there is "no victimless divorce." When marriage fails, everyone is Murt. Adjustment is worse and year after the divorce than two months after the divorce.

What's rone wing with marriage? The problem," accordto Dr. J. A. Reference, "is not in the institution but in
the partners. The real problem is in the person himself
and that problem will, almost without exception, be found
immaturity."

A major news magarine carried a report on a group of divorced persons and each one had answered the question "Why did your marriage fail?" While they gave many reasons, one single reason dominated all others, "My marriage failed because of immaturity. —Fither we expected too much or too little. It was immaturity in our attitudes that was the basic problem in our marriage."

Immaturity is a major reason for marriage failure. How do you get mature attitudes? Only one fully mature person ever lived—Jesus Christ: Note the following marks as seen in Jesus by Dr. Peterson:

Jesus was never upset by circumstatices, either major or minor ones.

Jesus was able to adjust to situations realizing what could and could not be changed.

Jesus proved to be adequate for situations and he drew deeply on his inner resources.

Sometimes marriage partners will say, "But we can't change". True, some things we may not be able to change But we can change! By God's grace and through His Son we can become mature enough to make our marriage work.



Just because we have had one every summer for several years doesn't move us. It takes more than this and a good VBS offers more!

IN LISTENING TO A SERMON

God has always used preaching to change lives and increase His kingdom. No doubt, Noah preached for 120 years. John the Baptist preached in the Wilderness of Judea, Jesus preached in the synagogues of Jersalem and Paul preached before kings, queens and other royalty. God still uses this method to reach souls..."It pleased God by the foolishness of preaching to save them—that believe." (1Cor. 1:21)

It takes two for a sermon to be effective and bring results. It takes a preacher and a listener. There is as much an art to listening to a sermon as there is to preaching it. We need to learn how to listen to a sermon. May I offer some worthwhile tips?

- 1. Try not to be a criticizing listener. The preacher makes mistakes as well as we do. If he were perfect, he would not be here. Perfection lies in the life ahead.
- 2. Try not to be a sermon fitter. Often you hear "Boy, that would have been a good one for so and so". If the sermon does not fit you, let your neighbor fit it to himself.
- 3. Try to listen with an open mind. You may disagree with the sermon, but remember a sermon is not only to lift you up and agree with you, but also to disturb your complacency.

4. Try to listen with the attitude, "Speak, Lord, thy servant heareth", ISam. 3:9. A mind that has been prepared by prayer and expectation is always ready to listen to what the Lord says.

5. Finally, try to listen with a receptive heart. "Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts: And see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting", Psa.139:23, 24. Let the searchlight of the gospel reveal the need in your heart.

Let us remember that the greatest speaker in the world fails in the desired results of preaching without the proper attention from his listeners. The Master Preacher had those in His day turn their ears from the truth. For the gospel to bring its happy results there must be good listeners as well as good preachers. What kind of listener are you? What kind of listener and preacher am I?

Often we hear a statement which sounds like it comes from the Bible, which is not really a Biblical quotation at all. Test you Bible knowledge by determining which of the following quotations are actually from the Bible and which are only "chimney corner scripture."


