"If there come any winto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive him not into your house, neither bid him God speed: for he that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deed." - 2 John 10-11.

It is with a great deal of sadness that I hear members of the Lord's church jump to the defense of proponents of error and false doctrine. If a man has achieved any degree of prominence and a following, he becomes a "sacred cow" whose false representation of the gospel of Christ ought to be overlooked because he seems to "do some good." Brethmen, this ought not to be!

Paul certainly did not adopt a "hands off" policy when he encountered those who were perverting the gospel in his day. "As we said before, so say I now again, if any man preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed" (Gal.1:9). That is pretty trong language. But Paul knew that more than feelings were at stake; it was a matter of souls being lost.

Suppose for a moment taht a cure for cancer had been found and was available for the asking. And along comes a man advertises himself as an expert on cancer and tells people that they ought to be taking a sugar pill which he has for sale, never telling them about the real cure. He gathers a large following and the people who need the cure, instead take the sugar pill-confident that they need nothing further. What do you think ought to be done with such a man? Praise him because he has, for the time being, given a more positive cutlook on life to those who are dying? Defend his right to teach whatever he believes? As a minimum we would judge the man as a criminal who deserves to be locked up with the key thrown away.

How then can anyone defend a man who does not teach people what to so to receive the cure for the plague that will bring eternal death? Everytime I see a rally on television with thousands in attendance, and they are told to simply take Jesus into their hearts—to just believe God for salvation—and then hundreds searching for eternal life flood the aisles never knowing that God"s Word requires more; it breaks my heart to consider what good might have been done had not the gospel been perverted.

Brethren, we need to understand that tampering with a person's soul is serious business. God's Word condemns one who perverts the gospel. How dare any Christians to stand for his defense! ____Chuck Barrington, Donmcyer Digest

Jesus said the world would know we are His, "if we have love one for another." It is time our love caused us to care enough to reach out and touch those about us who have been overcome by the World.



One of the great failings in the church today is that most people do not get much from the sermon. I recognize that we often preach sermons that may not contain much for the listeners to get. But, we know that the majority of the sermons have something that everyone of us can use that would really help our Christian living.

Probably the main deterent of getting something out of the sermon is the wandering mind. We hear a thought and immediately launch out in another direction on our own. Psychologists tell us that we hear about 125 words a monute and that the mind can think about 450 words per minute. We can easily race ahead of any speaker with our own thoughts.

It would help each listener if he or she brought a pad or a note card and took notes on the sermon. Try to outline the lesson. Put down scripture references and look them up later. Notice how many scriptures are in the lesson. I wonder what this would do for us as preachers if we knew that our audience was taking notes that would show how much preparationwe had made and how easily our sermon could be outlined? I also wonder if we would not put in more scripture if we knew that people could ; see just how much was there from their own notes. I have listened to sermons that I outlined and found not one verse of scripture. That was no sermon; a nice lecture, maybe, but no sermon.


To get more out of a sermon we should bring our own Bible or New Testement ment. We should feel free to write in it and make notes. If the preacher brings home the truth of a certain passage that we had not learned before, this would be the time to make a note in the margin beside the passage.

We ought to come with the determination that we are going to get something out of the lesson. Attitude is very important here. Come with disinterest and you will not leave with anything. Come hungering and thirsting, and you will be filled.

Good listening will take some diligence on the part of all of us. As children of God, we all ought to get more from the sermons we hear.
