THE CROCKED PINS

I once read a story of how pins are made. A long brass wire is drawn in at one end of a machine, and at the other end out come the rins. Most of them are fine and straight, but a few come out crooked. They all drop into a heap, the crooked and the straight together. No one wants crooked pins, so they must be picked out from the others and set aside.

In sorting the pins nobody's eyes look for them; hobody's fingers pick them out. Each pin is made to go to its own place. The straight ones roll off easily, but a crooked pin can't roll, so the bent ones stay on the ribabon and when they come to the end of it they drop off into a box of waste.

People are like pins. Many are "straight", but not all. Some have bent places in them. Someday the crooked ones will be seperated from the s traight and each will find his own place. Man is able during his life to straighten the bent places and become straight. Lets not come to the end of life in a bent state. It will be too late to do anything then.




