

Christians should be very patient with one another when one is struggling to over come a weakness in his life. The struggle against sin is a continuing battle. We are to bear with one another in this struggle, to be patient and longsuffering. If a brother or sister has a particular problem and is sincerely trying to wrestle with it we must be willing to forgive 70 times 7 times. That is an awful lot, yet we must be patient, for by patience many a victory is won.

On the other hand whenever a brother or sister cheats, tries to live like the world part of the time and be a Christian a nother part of the time, that person needs urgent attention. None profess to attain to the high standard of Christ, but all must profess to be committed to it, and demonstrate this commitment by their efforts to overcome sin. Nothing is more destructive to the vigor and power of the gospel than hypocrisy. Perhaps the extreme punishment administered to Annanias and Saphira was to teach us the importance of this. (Acts 5)

To the sincere person who is struggling, the church must extend the strong arm of forgiveness repeatedly, but the insincere cheater needs to be made aware of the wrath of the Lord. There are few influences that are more powerful at persuading people of the value of the gospel than the sincere, earnest Christian, who doesn't claim to be perfect, but who does sincerely, steadfastly seek to live as Christ teaches men to live.

ACCEPTABLE WORSHIP

There are some who are, because of conditions beyond their control, unable to assemble with the saints when the Lord's Supper is eaten; and because of that, arra ngements are made for a later observance on that day. But it is exceedingly that the Lord will accept the worship of those who deliberately neglect the regular service in order to do their own bidding. This should cause those who want some extra sleep, to visit or engage in pursuits of pleasure, to examine more closely the word of the Lord. (Jas. 2:10; 4:17)

ARCHEOLOGY AND THE BIBLE

Do you believe that the Garden of Eden was a real place? We often hear this question or one like it in regard to many places, persons and events recorded in the Bible. Somehow, many have come to believe that, for one reason or another, the Bible is an untrustworthy book.

It is true that we cannot precisely locate the Garden of Eden to-day, but it is equally true that its location is generally referred to in the book of Genesis. We are told in the second chapter of Gensis that four rivers were in and about the area. One of those rivers is said to encompass the whole land of Ethiopia. Another of the rivers was named Hiddekel, which is the ancient name for the Tigris. A third river is said to be the Euphrates. The only conclusion is that the Garden of Eden lay somewhere within the Tigris and Euphrates Valley; this area, of course, being Mesopotamia which means the area between the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers.

The geographical cues in the book of Genesis which relate to other more demonstrable places and events lends credence to the view that the Garden of Eden is also historical and should be literally understood so.



Julius Caesar, is credited with saying, "Men freely believe that which they desire."

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts." Isa.55:6-9

When man follows his own thinking and his own ways he never gets any higher than this old sin-cursed earth. To rise above this level he must think the thoughts of God as revealed in the inspired word, the Bible, and follow the Word of God revealed through the only begotten Son.

Solomon says of man, "As he thinketh in his heart, so is he." Man has the choice of thinking his own thoughts and following his own ways and being lost eternally, or thinking the thoughts of God and following the Way of God and being saved eternally. Which way are you following?



On SundayMarch 22, 1979 a family placed membership at a church in Arkansas - hardly significant news. We probably visualize three or four people walking down the a isle at the singing of the invitation song, sitting down on the front row, putting their names on a card, then checking the little bloack down in the corner in front of To Place Membership. They may have done that, but the significant thing is, they did more. They handed the elders a letter - no, not a letter of recommendation, but their own letter.

It said, "... We are asking to commit the welfare of our souls to your care. Although the weakness of the flesh often betrays us, the prime objective of our lives is obtaining salvation for ourselves, our children, and our fellowman. We therefore aks with all sincerity that you will help us in every possible way to be successful in this endeator. Besides spiritual food, encouragement and fellowship, we fully expect that the help you give might well take the form of numerous requests to serve, instruction, correction, and if necessary even discipline. With this in mind, we ask that when and if either of us fails to measure up in a given task that you do not write us off, but help us grow and as soon as possible try us again. We view membership in a congregation as an obligation to be subject to its eldership, to be (Continued on back)

DEACONS

Since the pale of death pierces every mortal it is necessary for all of us to learn how to handle bereavement. I have watched with great admiration and respect the courage that has borne many a saint through hours of sorrow. Here is some practical advice I have seen others use in dealing with grief:

1. EXPRESS YOUR EMOTIONS. It should not be considered a Christian virtue to be unmoved by the loss of a loved one. There is a difference between suppressing one's emotions and losing one's self control. The Bible does not say, "Sorrow not"; but it says, "Sorrow not as others who have no hope" (1 Thess. 4:13).

2. SEEK THE AID OF YOUR FRIENDS. The very presence of friends is an encouragement. When Paul neared Rome, the brethren came to meet him and he

"thanked God and took courage" (Acts 28:15).

3. COMPELL YOURSELF TO BE WITH PEOPLE. Your inclination may be to retreat into the refuge of privacy, but there is a greater need than one realizes to associate with others. David did (2 Sam. 12:19-23).

4. EXFRESS YOUR FEELINGS WITH WORDS. Talking about it will help you to accept it. If this is done at the outset of bereavement, one will sooner be able to stabilize him life.

be able to stabilize his life.

5. AVAIL YOURSELF OF SPIRITUAL RESOURCES. Even though you may not have realized the importance of the scriptures and their comfort, now these can help in building your faith. The power of prayer and the peace of God are very precious possessions.

6. DON'T BROCD OVER WHAT MIGHT HAVE BEEN. Both Mary and Martha said, "If

thou hadst been here my brother had not died" (John 11:21-32).

7. ACTIVELY PURSUE WORTHWHILE TASKS. Once the initial shock has been dealt with, get busy at other things. Resolve like Paul to "reach forth unto things which are before" (Phil. 3:13).

8. MAKE CAREFUL AND THOUGHTFUL DECISIONS. Many an individual humps hastily into deciding the full scope of the future ra ther than waiting until he has regained a proper perspective of life. Don't get in a hurry. Make prayerful decisions.

9. INCREASE YOUR TRUST IN GOD. Those who have come through their sorrows with deeper faith can verify that God who rules over all truly does

make all things work together for good (Rom. 8:28).

After the crisis of grief, you can serve more fully and sympathize more completely with men of like passions. With Paul you too can thank God for the comfort received knowing that it has now given you the ability to comfort others who are in any trouble (2 Cor. 1:4). -Hardeman Nichols

THE DECADE OF THE 80's

The 60's and 70's have been designated by some as a period of revolt, rebellion and disillusionment. The 80's are being projected as a time of revival. Let us trust that the next decade will see a return to religion, for unless we do we may not get back.

A recent Gallup Poll shows that 61 million adults in America are without religious affiliation. It shows further that "church membership" is declining. Only 38% of the unchurched expressed any confidence in the church. They criticize organized religion as: (1) having lost it spiritual parts (2) being too concerned with organization as opposed to spiritual issues (3) ineffective in helping people find meaning for their lives.

But the rest of the sample is brighter. 91% welcome more emphasis on home life; 89% desire a greater respect for authority; 69% want the work ethic to be stressed more; 62% oppose more sexual liberty.

Perhaps if the church will stand strong in its opposition to sin and will help men and women find meaning for their lives the 1980's will be a decade of revival.

"ALL. CR NOTHING AT ALL"

David LloydGoerge once remarked. "The most dangerous thing in the world is to try to leap a chasm in two jumps." The story is told of the little boy who cut off his puppies! tail an inch at a time to keep it from hurting so badly by cutting the whole tail off at once. These two situations illustrate the tragic error of many persons with respect to Christ.

Accepting Christ is an all-or-nothing commitment. Trying to accept Christ without total commitment to him is like trying to leap a chasm in two jumps - you leave one bank and miss the other. Jesus said it like this: "He that is not for me is against me." The Lord will not share a divided heart. Look to Christ. commit your life, your talents, your service, your all. Look not for a stone or island halfway. There is none.

The second situation above may well illustrate the other side of commitment to Christ. Commitment to one thing means forsaking other things. "You cannot serve God and mammon." You cannot hold both God and the world. Sometimes a person tries to give up the world like the boy cut off his puppy's tail - an inch at a time. The result is the same - pain is multiplied.

Make clear decisions. Leave the world. "Come up - come all the way up" to Christ. You can't leap a chasm in two jumps. Leave the shores of sin decisively, with finality, holding no mementoes of a single past. Commit your all to Christ! -Howard Horton

A TREMENDOUS RESPONSIBILITY. Men who lead in public prayer have a tremendous responsibility. Think of what a responsibility it is! Here is a waiting congregation that has come together to worship God. In the congregation there are many souls who are eager to go to God in prayer with other Christians and pour out thier hearts to God. Yet many times their longings are unsatisfied because of an inadequate prayer that has been led. A man who leads prayer can help bring a congregation closer to God or take it farther from Him. Again, we say, What a responsibility!

FRAY IN JESUS! NAME. Another important thing; pray in the name of Jesus. Do not say to the Father, "We pray in thy name." We are to pray to God the Father in the name of his Son. (Heb. 13:15; 4:14). Do not abruptly close the prayer without mention of our great High Priest through whom we approach the Father.

AT THE LCRD'S TABLE. When at the Lord's Table you are offering thanks for the bread. do that. Some ask God to bless others; some thank God for the many blessings of life, including the Lord's Day; but they do not offer thanks for the bread. They do just about everything except what they should do. It is good to pray for others, to thank God for our many blessings, etc. But what about offering thanks for the bread and the cup? Isn't that what Jesus did when he instituted the supper?

Occasionally we have someone thank God for the fruit of the vine "which so beautifully represents thy shed blood." Let's remember that it was not the Father who shed his blood on the cross. R. L. Whiteside wrote these words: "Certainly a Christian should know who was crucified." We would add that of a double certainty one who leads a congrega tion in prayer should know that it was the Son, not the Father, who shed his blood on the cross.

SFEAK SO AS TO BE HEARD. Paul, discussing tongues, asked, "How shall he that occupieth the room of the unlearned say Amen at thy giving of thanks, seeing he understandeth not what thou sayest?" (ICor, 14:16) We can apply the same question to those who speak in such a low and indistinct voice when they lead a prayer. How can others assent to the prayer unless they can hear it? How can they join in the prayer? Speak up! If necessary, practice speaking out in the open spaces. Develop a voice that can be heard. ... We should not pray being morivated by a desire to be heard by men; but if we lead in public prayer, we surely ought to pray in a way that can be heard -Selected & Adapted

What do you do with your old Bibles after they have been replaced by newer ones? Maybe a few loose pages, a torn or missing cover, but still useful. Somehow I just can't get myself to throw it away so it sets on the shelf or packed away in some box gathering dust. Their goal is collect 2,000,000 used Bibles for this need. The Bibles will be collected here and then forwarded to the church in Orlinda, Tenn. to be repaired and shipped to Africa. It costs about \$1 to pack and ship each Bible so a small donation would also be appreciated. -Norm
