





Upper Midwest Campaigns for Jesus Christ - LOOKING AHEAD

At present there are 317 Christian men and women in the Upper Midwest who have successfully completed the FISHERS OF MEN person-to-person Evangelism Training Course. By the end of 1979 we expect that number to be at about 400. That's exciting!

In 1980, and each year thereafter, we plan to train approximately 300 brethren. Thus, by January 1, 1985 we will have graduated 1,900 Christians from the FOM course. That's very exciting!

Our experience so far shows that we can very reasonably anticipate that each FOM graduate will bring, at the very minumum, at least one lost soul to the Lord Jesus Christ. This means that on New Year's Day, 1985 we will look out on the Upper Midwest and see the equivalent of at least 15 additional congregations with 100 members. That's Super exciting!

Obviously, many FOM graduates will teach and baptize considerably more than one person in the next five years. Some may baptize none. It is entirely realistic, however, to project that each graduate, on the average, will teach and baptize at least one soul each year. Even that conservative estimate translates into 6,500 souls daved in the Upper Midwest through the efforts of FOM graduates in 1980-84. That's extremely exciting!

Most exciting of all, however, are the results we can expect if we just keep believing that... God is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us (Eph. 3:20).

THE CHURCH IS NOT A HOSPITAL

"I am come that they might have life, that they might have it more abundantly."

John 10:10

Several times I've heard it said that the church is a hospital for sick Christians. I believe this is a most unfortunate description. It is normal for a hospital to be filled with sick people, and this description gives the impression that the normal thing in a church is sick Christians. There are sick Christians in churches and it is the duty of the church to minister to them, but they should be the exception and not the rule. There are no perfect Christians, but we should all be healthy Christians. One may be healthy without being perfect.

Today we expect the subnormal as though it were normal. The New Testament standard is not imperfection. But let any minister preach the high standards of the scriptures and he will hear the complaint, "nobody could be that good. According to that there isn't a Christian in town."

Our Lord came that we might have life and have it more abundantly. A revival is simply a return to spiritual good health. The church is not a nursery for babies still on milk who should have long since been on meat. Sometimes the church does become a spiritual hospital for we'll need examination, diagnosis and treatment, and even surgery. And it does partake of the function of a nursery to young Christians. But we must get over the idea that it is normal to be weak and sickly when we should be living abundantly.

- 6. PUT first things first. Make up your mind that nothing will be allowed to take precedence over our gospel meeting. Put God where He belongs in your life ...crown Him as Lord of your life. "But seek ye first his kingdom, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." (Matt.6:33).

CLEAN UP TV CAMPAIGN

"And have no fellowship with the unfruitful works of darkness, but rather even reprove them."

Eph. 5:11

The Campaign among members of the Lord's church to clean up TV of filth, immorality, and violence is now underway. Spearheading this drive is the Joelton Church of Christ in Nashville, Tennessee. In a recent newsletter they reported that over six tons of forms were sent to over 16,000 churches throughout the nation.

Beginning March 16, hundreds of thousands of Christians and concerned individuals will be indicating their commitment to improve the moral quality of television programming. A warning has been issued to three companies who presently sponsor some of the most offensive shows on television. This warning in affect says, unless they discontinue sponsorship of such shows promptly, we intend to sign a solomn promise not to knowingly buy any of their products for a period of three months. The cards also make it clear that if no action is forthcoming than this promise will be automatically renewed for additional three month periods for as long as may be necessary.

Due to the Gospel Meeting on March 16, cards were handed out and signed the 23rd. The response was most encouraging. Already 104 signed cards were sent to the Joelton church for a nation-wide tabulation and to be delivered to the companies involved. Since the campaign will continue until Sunday April 13, we have requested an additional 500 cards. This will give each member an opportunity to involve five other interested individuals in this campaign. We have also ordered some bumper stickers and posters for display around the community. We believe it's about time the "silent majority" in America began to be heard about this problem which is contributing to the problem of our nation's moral decadence.

For your information the five most offensive programs on TV as indicated from a recent nation-wide survey of Churches of Christ were: 1. "Soap" 2. "Three's Company" 3. "The Newlywed Game" 4. "Dallas" 5. "Saturday Night Live". The three companies that sponsor these shows and some of their better known products are as follows: General Foods: Kool Aid, Orange Plus, Log Cabin Syrup, Gravy Train and Jell-O. Warner-Lambert: Listerine, Dentyne gum, Certs, Bromo-Seltzer and Shick razor blades. American Home Products: Chef Boy-Ar-Dee, Jiffy Pop popcorn, Brach's candies, Woolite and Black Flag insecticides.
