More actual work is expended in our "church play" than in preaching the gospel to the lost in many instances.

WE PLAY AT OUR WORSHIP. Yea, we are dabblers in the religion of Christ. We want our worship in small doses. The attitude of "just enough to satisfy the minimum requirements of the Scriptures" is more widespread than many realize. One hour, once per week, is the worship program of the majority of those who claim to be New Testament Christians. Our Lord demands that we give Him the first and the best of our time, efforts, and substance. He will accept no less. When one gives less his worship is vain! Only when we offer all that we are and possess will He accept our worship and reward our service!

IN THE COMING YEAR let us all resolve to put God and His Kingdom first!

COURAGE

"Be of good courage and let us play the man for our people, and for the cities of our God." (2 Samuel 10:12)

Someone has defined courage as "fighting with the handle after the sword has been broken." Courage is that quality of mind which enables one to meet danger with firmness and without fear.

History is full of many examples of unusual courage. After the battle of Marengo had been lost, Napoleon came to his drummer boy and said: "Beat a retreat!" The boy replied: "Sir, I can beat a charge. My master taught me to beat a charge, but not a retreat. I do not know how to beat a retreat. I can beat a charge that will wake up the dead. I beat the charge at Lodi and the Pyramids. Shall I beat a charge?" Napoleon was so impressed that he said: "Beat a charge!" The boy beat a charge, which rallied a defeated army to renew the battle with such courage and determination that Marengo is numbered among the outstanding victories of Napoleon. After this battle, Napoleon had medals struck for its heroes. On one side the medal read, "Marengo"; on the other side, "I was there".

However, the finest examples of courage are to be found in the Bible, and not in secular history. For sheer moral courage we must go to such examples as Noah, preaching to wicked generation of his day: Joseph, fleeing the evil advances of Potiphar's wife; Moses, demanding of Pharoah to release Israel; Gideon, with his 300 men who routed the Midianites; Daniel, purposing not to defile himself with the king's dandies; Paul, preaching on Mars Hill and before Nero; and such like who have immortalized sacred history.

One of the crying needs of our time is courage - courage to live right; courage to preach the truth, without fear or favor, to both saint and sinner. "Be of good courage", brother; "let us play the man" for the church of our Lord and the truth of His gospel. When the shattered remnants of the Old Guard were called on to surrender at the battle of Waterloo, they replied: "We know how to die, but not to surrender". The apostles knew how to die for "the word of God and the testimony of Jesus", but they did not know how to surrender.
