The church in Rome had a problem understanding their freedom also. Unlike immigrants to America, the Romans were being told by Paul that they were being set free in order to become slaves all over again! "FOLLOW ME"

"Whoever serves me must follow me; and where I am, my servant will also be, My Father will honor the one who serves me."

John 12:26

Many people today really believe they are following Jesus by simply attending a church service, being religious, or by being a "pretty good person". I am so glad that Jesus does not just ask us to follow Him but also makes it clear to us what He expects of those who do choose to follow after Him. Following Jesus is not always easy but it is always rewarding. Following Jesus takes time and testing but will ultimately lead us in triumph.

TIME

Jesus wanted His disciples to be with Him. He loved to spend time with them. Jesus called them to follow Him (Mark 1:17). From that time on He walked (Mark 1:21, ate (John 4:31), taught (Matthew 5:1), and even slept (Luke 8:23) with them. Jesus Knew that for the disciples to really know Him and grow to trust Him completely with their lives, they needed to spend lots of time with Him. In the same way today as we try to understand jesus and who He is we also will never really know Jesus unless we spend time with Him. Many people know a lot about Jesus, but never really get to know Jesus Himself. We need to spend lots of time with Jesus through His Word and through prayer. How much effort have you really given to know Jesus? If you really want to get to know Jesus here are three practical things you should do:

- (1) Begin by reading one of the Gospels. Take at least 30 minutes each day.
- (2) Pray every day that God will help you to know Jesus through His Word.

(3) Ask someone you know who has a great relationship with Jesus to help you study the Bible and really get to know Jesus.

TESTING

Jesus spent time with His disciples teaching them and sharing His life with them but there came a time in their relationship when He laid it out to them exactly what it would mean for them to have a lasting relationship with Him. In Luke 14:25-33, Jesus turned to the crowds who were "following" Him and told them what it really means to follow Him. Jesus did not want a bunch of people following Him around but He wanted a commitment from those who would really be His followers. Jesus expected them to love Him more than any other relationship (verse 27). Today, Jesus expects the same type of commitment from us. In order to be a disciple and follower of Jesus, we must be willing to surrender our lives to Him. We must be willing to not only know Jesus' teachings, but to wholeheartedly follow them. Every decision we make should be measured by the question "What would Jesus do?" This type of commitment will test our hearts and separate the true followers of Jesus from those who simply want to hang around hoping to receive the benefits yet never contributing to the relationship.

TRIUMPH

In John 12:26 Jesus said that God will honor those who follow Him. What an exciting promise! Though there are great costs in following Jesus, they in no way compare to the rewards we receive by having a close relationship with Him. In Mark 10:28-31, Jesus told His disciples about the blessings they would receive. He said "No one who has left home or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields for me and the gospel will fail to receive a hundred times as much in this present age (homes, brothers, sisters, mothers, children, fields—and with them persecutions) and in the age to come, eternal life." Followers of Jesus will not only receive blessings in this life such as deep relationships with other Christians—"fathers, mothers, sisters, brothers" and "children" (those we help to come into a relationship with Jesus)—but also the promise of living with God, Jesus and His Spirit eternally in heaven. What an incredible promise!

Following Jesus is the most exciting thing a person could ever want to do. Jesus will help you deal with the problems of life, give you tremendous blessings, challenge you incredibly, and help you to make changes in your life and character that you never thought were possible. Make a decision to really follow Jesus, commit your life to that decision and "buckle your seatbelt" for the most exciting and challenging life you could ever imagine - for eternity!

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SISTER - TO - SISTER

This Saturday we will reveal ourselves to the sister we've been a secret to for 6 months. Aren't you glad that we are not "secretly sisters" to each other all of the time?! We'd never receive an encouraging word, a hug, a praise, a compliment, a good deed or gentle instruction from one another.

After stopping to think, maybe some of us are staying a secret to the other sisters. Do you not want your sisters to know the real you? Yes, you sin and fall short of living Gods plan for your life. So do I and all your other sisters. Keeping up appearances that everything is great and there is no struggle in your life is tiresome. We can probably succeed in giving this pretense at least the three times we assemble, but it forces us to stay distant, a secret, the rest of the week. You know you hurt inside. It's been there for years. The Lords remedy is simple.

Is any one of you in trouble? He should pray. Is anyone happy? Let him sing songs of praise. Is anyone of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be forgiven. Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man is powerful and effective.

James 5:13-16

Swallow your pride. Step out this week and reveal yourself to a sister who loves you, will minister to you and will share such a close relationship to build you up in the Lord. You'll be doing the same for her.

"BECOMING A DISCIPLE"

Becoming a disciple and maturing as a Christian is an immeasurable joy and privilege. It involves not only a change in actions but, more importantly, a profound transformation in which our hearts and attitudes become more like those of Christ.

SURRENDER. One of the most exciting aspects of becoming a disciple is the opportunity to have a brand new life. Ironically, what happens is that although we add lots of good things to our lives as new Christians, we fail to truly surrender our old life to God. II Corinthians 5:18 tells us that in Christ we are new creations, that the old life is gone. When we are baptized, it is as if we traded in our old, dented car for a shiny new one. The lie Satan wants us to believe, however, is that our old, dented car got a few repairs but is basically the same old car with the same basic problems. Are you truly a new creation? Or do you say things like "I've always teen that way" or "I have never been able to change that". I praise God that He really can change people from the inside out. We, as disciples, need to recognize ungodly patterns such as selfdestructiveness, excessive quilt, emotionalism and "pet sins" not as inevitable behavior, but as Satan's trap from which Christ has already set us free.

SACRIFICE. It is easy to view becoming a disciple as simply doing more "good things" while still being very protective of our time, our career and our reputation. If we harbor these attitudes, how will we respond to being asked to "give up everything" we have (Luke 14:33) and "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19)? But is that not exactly what Jesus said we needed to do to be a disciple? What has your salvation cost you? Where has your salvation taken you? Just like

a fine diamond, that which is precious is costly. Similarly, just as we treat our costume jewelry with less care, we will fail to truly appreciate a Christian life that costs us little. The last thing a disciple should do is protect himself from struggles and sacrifices. Persecutions, long prayers, fasting and pouring out our lives for God and others are the price we are privileged to pay to stand firm to the end.

SECURITY. With God, we search for the true love found only in God but upon finding it, we have problems accepting it. This insecurity can be eradicated from our lives when we understand the depth of the statement "What good is it for a man to gain the whole world and yet lose or forfeit his very self?" (Luke 9:25). Jesus is saving that even the most lowly soul is worth more than all the riches in all the world. And God confirmed that sentiment by sending Jesus to die for us "while we were still sinners" (Romans 5:8). How can we feel insecure if we truly grasp this profound love, memorizing, meditating on and claiming God's promises. So much of feeling secure in God's love is a decision to believe not what we tell ourselves and not what the world tells us but what God tells us. We need to feel so secure in God's love that doubting it will be as uncalled for as doubting our name or birthday. There is no more God can do to prove His love. But will we accept it? Let us surrender, sacrifice and enjoy the security of being in Christ.

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SISTER - TO - SISTER

This is the time of year for "Garage Sales". In newspapers from most "Small Towns, USA" the classifieds are loaded with columns of eager families awaiting the day to rid themselves of the junk they've accumulated and become a little richer!

As sisters in Christ, we need to take some inventory of what we've accumulated or maybe never oot rid of after becoming a child of God.

1. "The moving sale": "Will sell till it's gone" is the caption in one ad. Sisters, we need to apply some dedicated persistence in ridding ourselves of those things we can't take with us on our Christian journey. At the point of our decision to follow Christ we should have counted the cost of moving - from an earthly woman to a spiritual woman. II Cor. 5:17 makes it plain: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!"

Some of us are still clinqing to our old self and ways. Perhaps the price is too high?!! "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his father, mother, his wife and children, his brothers and sisters - yes even his own life - he cannot be my disciple." (Luke 14:26)

To move forward in your Christian life, Jesus must come FIRST. You'll see that getting rid of putting yourself, physical family and your worldly desires before Christ will allow you to move freely, with no ties from the world to keep pulling you back.

2. "The garage sale": This sale usually consists of toasters that don't work, stained clothing, chairs with the legs glued on and a box of Harlequin Romances.

How about this list from Col. 3:8-10a, "But now you must rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander and filthy language from your lips. Do not lie to each other since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self..." Time to start hauling that junk right out of your life!

3. "The multi-family sale": Some old, some new - a little of everything. How true in the church with all our individual personalities. various convictions and separate goals! We've got to get this house cleaned out or no one will want to come to see us.

Some of us will have to give, some take. Some serve, some be served. some repent, some forgive.

"If you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from His love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then having the same love, being one in Spirit and purpose." (Phil. 2:1-2)

Make your commitment to Jesus for life. Put to death those things which make you weak. See your brothers and sisters as the family God planned for us to be. He needs us to be unified in Him and in our purpose as Christians. He's given us the task to love Him and men so that we may all be with Him in that heavenly home.

There won't be any Garage Sales there! He makes us exceedingly rich!

CONSUMED WITH ZEAL

"Zeal for your house will consume me."

John 2:17

As we look at the life of Jesus Christ, we are amaze. The high level of intensity in which He existed. He possessed a constant, single-minded focus and an unparalleled maturity. He was consumed with a zeal that was unquenchable. That zeal can be reproduced in our hearts if we:

- (1) Know the Father like Jesus did;
- (2) Are committed to righteousness like Jesus was; and
- (3) Are focused on our purpose.

ZEAL FOR THE FATHER

Jesus had a deep heart-felt zeal for the Father. Everything He did flowed naturally from His relationship with God. As Jesus arrived in Jerusalem for the Passover, He found men selling cattle, sheep and doves and exchanging money in the temple courts. These people had not just started these practices that day. A slow progression of compromises over a long period of time had brought them to where they were.

Why is it that Jesus alone recognized that God's house had been defiled? Jesus had such intimate fellowship with God that He recognized what was wrong because He knew what was right. That which everyone else had come to accept as the norm was personally offensive to Jesus. If our own personal walk with God is not intense, we will see the same thing happen in our hearts that happened in the temple. Hebrews 5:7 says, "...he offered up prayers and petitions with loud cries and tears...". Does that describe your walk with lou? There must be an emotional connection that takes place in our

daily quiet times and throughout the day. Too often our prayers become stale, surface, "grocery list" prayers rather than deep times of communication and fellowship. Let us be committed to putting our hearts into connecting with God and we can begin to have the zeal that Jesus had.

ZEAL FOR RIGHTEOUSNESS

When Jesus saw men abusing the temple of God for their own selfish gains, His immediate response was to make a whip out of cords and drive them out. He could have just become exasperated and walked out, but He knew He was responsible to take action.

Today, we are the temple of the living God (II Corinthians 6:16). When we allow sin to exist in our hearts and in the hearts of our brothers and sisters, we are as offensive to God as the merchants and moneychangers who had defiled His holy temple. As Jesus was with them so we need to be with our hearts. We must take personal responsibility and act aggressively against sin. Too often we take a feather duster to our sin when we need to get serious and use a whip! Sin destroys the Kingdom. It is so deceitful that, before you realize, it has crept in and become an accepted and comfortable way of life. The heart is a storage place for every kind of evil practice. Each person has the capacity to commit even the vilest of sins. We must become zealous in eradicating these sins as soon as we are confronted with them by:

- (1) Committing to righteousness at all costs;
- (2) Allowing the Word to cut your heart:
- (3) Fasting and praying for God to break your heart;
- (4) Confessing daily it should be painful!; and
- (5) Praying for strength in moments of weakness.

By facing our \sin and taking action against it, we will prevent Satan from winning victories in our hearts.

ZEAL FOR HIS PURPOSE

The entire life of Jesus is surrounded by one common theme - death itself. No matter what situation He was found in, He was always focused on the lost world and thus the cross. He knew His purpose and was willing to totally spend Himself for it. Possessing the zeal and maturity of Christ means embracing the cross daily in our lives. II Corinthians 4:10 says, "We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body." Jesus never existed in comfort. A zealous Christian will never be a comfortable Christian. Every day we must lay our lives aside and become like Jesus, as a disciple; as as a discipler; as a friend to the lost; as a servant and as a confronter of sin. The Kingdom needs Christians who will lead the way in zeal. Christians who refuse to give up no matter what the cost. May we become Christians consumed with the zeal that will compel us to reach the world with the gospel!



N TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 9, 1965, at 5:28 p.m., a giant power failure centered in the Boston-Washington megalopolis reduced some 30,000,000 people in six states to 19th century living conditions for several hours. Everything electrically-powered ground to a halt in the ensuing darkness. There were no lights, no elevators, no television or radio stations. Refrigerators stopped and freezers de-frosted. Planes, circling above, could find no place to land. Life changed dramatically in a few seconds.

Ours is an age of power—political, military, atomic, financial, electric, even "horse" power. We respect power. The pursuit of it has often engaged man in evil activities. Once acquired and worshiped, power will ultimately destroy. Within its rightful perimeters, however, power is useful and beneficial. If any power fails, or we become cut off from it, our lives are severely affected. We become paralyzed.

What Is Power?

Power has been defined as "the ability to achieve a purpose." Every kind of power has its objective: it is harnassed to achieve some specific goal. A locomotive has the power to pull many cars, but it is powerless to teach mathematics. A rocket engine can boost huge missiles into space, but it is powerless to make a flower grow. Power is powerless for purposes for which it is not intended.

God's Power

The gospel, the preaching of the cross of Christ, is God's power to achieve his purpose. His purpose is the salvation of mankind (Romans 1:16). No other kind of power can do the gospel's job. Without the gospel, we experience spiritual power failure, salvation is unattainable, and God's plan is thwarted.

Philosophies or other substitutes can achieve the purposes for which they exist, but they cannot do the work the gospel was created to do. Science and technology can help us accumulate those things which rust and can be stolen, but they cannot help us to lay up treasures in heaven (Matthew 6:19, I Timothy 6:19-20). The gospel of love is God's power to create new and eternal life.

It is unfortunate that much of contemporary theology has relegated the name of God to the obituary column and has become increasingly speechless so far as the gospel is concerned. To speak of God's power to save, while modern man bows before his computers, cranes, and satellites, seems out of date. Some Christians allow themselves to be intimidated by their technological and theological environment, but they need to realize that, as Peter Taylor Forsythe observed, "unless there is within us that which is above us, we shall soon yield to that which is about us,"

Man-Power vs God-Power

After all, ours is not the first age which has got too big for God. It was in a Roman world that vibrated with man's power that the apostle Paul cried out: "I am not ashamed of God's power!" He could have been less vocal, because preaching the gospel got him into dangerous situations, but he insisted. He knew that his message was unique. For all her vaunted power, Rome knew nothing of the power "unto salvation" that Paul proclaimed. Rome's power might rule the world, but only God's power could save the world. It is not God's purpose to decide what type of government shall rule a nation; his purpose is to save people from their sins through Jesus Christ, a task for which the gospel is uniquely and adequately equipped. It, and it alone, can achieve God's purpose.

Have Power: Will Share

Although readily available in abundant supply, God's power is not power to everybody, but only "to everybody who believes"

(Romans 1:16). Access to God's power is by faith. Yet, faith is not our savior. Jesus remains the savior; the gospel, God's dynamite to break through hard hearts; and faith, the fuse by which the gospel's power is ignited and set off in our lives. The resulting new life, then, can glorify God in the church through Jesus Christ. God is able to do far beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us (Ephesians 3:20-21). We are now kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation (I Peter 1:5), and we have this gospel treasure in our bodies in order to show that the power comes from God and not from us (2 Corinthians 4:7).

DO YOU WANT TO GET WELL?

"Now there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades. Here a great number of disabled people used to lie - the blind, the lame, the paralyzed. One who was there had been an invalid for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, 'Do you want to get well?'"

John 5:2-6

Jesus asked a man who had been an invalid for thirty-eight years if he wanted to be healed. Why? Because He understood that even though the man wanted his situation to change, he was not willing to change himself. As we want the best for our families but we resist changing ourselves. In the January, 1988 edition of Better Homes and Gardens, an article on spirituality noted that out of 30,000 respondents, 80% wanted spiritual development for their family, but only 35% wanted to improve themselves. God has entrusted us with our families to bring them to Him. Not only teaching right, but being right. Our children will reflect what we are.

Our family roots shaped who we are. We are born trusting. When that trust is broken, we become insecure and learn sinful reactions to ward off pain and hurt. Each of us developed our own unique patterns, that is, our sinful nature. Three key ones are being weak-willed, the victim syndrome, and approval-seeking. We cannot be self-deceived about the impact that nature will make on our families.

DO YOU WANT TO BE HEALED OF BEING WEAK-WILLED? This is the

kind of person who is always learning but never changing (II Timothy 3:7). Saul is an example of someone who could never (1) stand with conviction about the truth (I Samuel 13:8-14), or (2) come to conviction about his sin (I Samuel 19:1-16). Jonathan lived his life trying to protect David from Saul but could never boldly take a stand against what Saul was doing. He died sitting on the fence between Saul and David. Our children see us not having deep convictions about discipling them. Sometimes we do and sometimes we do not. They learn that they do not have to be consistent in handling anger, habits, overeating, selfishness, or having convictions of their own about these things.

DO YOU WANT TO BE HEALED OF THE VICTIM SYNDROME? The blameshifter is always the victim of someone or something else, never assuming responsibility for their sin. The invalid in John 5 is an example of this. The result is children who do not assume responsibility for themselves. They learn to avoid conviction by using tears, really being hard on themselves or blaming you because you disciplined them, that is, worldly sorrow full of regrets (II Corinthians 7:8-11).

DO WE WANT TO BE HEALED OF APPROVAL-SEEKING? This person wants to be accepted. Everything they do is to please others. They become what they think will make other people like them. In the case of Eli, he honored his sons and the Israelite people more than God (I Samuel 2). His sin of wanting the approval of men rather than the approval of God kept him from truly being God's servant (Galations 1:10). There were several things that resulted: (1) he disobeyed God's law; (2) he did not have the heart and mind of God; (3) he did not teach his sons to have regard for the Lord; (4) his sins were magnified in his sons; (5) their rebellion appeared greater than his. Our children learn quickly that they can manipulate us because we want them to like us. Discipline will be weak and shallow, dealing only with superficial things since going for deep conviction would jeopardize our standing with them.

DO I REALLY WANT TO BE HEALED? We must face the fact that the longer we have been enslaved, the more self-deceived we are about (1) our sinful nature and (2) our desire to be healed. Therefore we must be 100% committed to seeing the things in our sinful nature and how we live accordto its desires (Romans 8:5). There will be pain involved in getting well (Hebrews 12:11). But we must go through the process of seeing, being cut to the heart, being convicted of sin and then repenting. It will mean open, vulnerable confession of sin (James 5:16). We will have to continually bring our sinful nature into the light in order to expose it. We will have to accept and trust our brethrens assessment of what they see in us. Proverbs says that the wise <u>listen</u> and the foolish do not accept advice. It also says that we "eat the fruit of our ways" and are "filled with the fruit of our schemes" (Proverbs 1:31).

If we are healed, the effect will be children who can be freed from their

own sinful reactions. They can be secure in who we are and learn to trust. They will become men and women who have deep convictions of their own and live victorious, confident lives (Revelation 15:1-4). God can then use our families to impact the world for Him.

And you have forgotten that word of encouragement that addresses you as sons: 'My son, do not make light of the Lord's discipline and do not lose heart when he rebukes you, because the Lord disciplines those he loves, and he punishes everyone he accepts as a son'" Hebreus 12:1-7

As families we are always surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses. We are constantly being looked at, listened to and evaluated by each other for what we do, what we say and how we appear. The Bible tells us to throw off everything that hinders us and everything that entangles us so we might have the correct focus and be able to see God's direction and plan. Let us look at some specific direction in order that what we do, what we say and how we appear may not entangle and hinder the people we love the most. Our Family.

THE FATHER'S PLAN

As fathers, God has given us a specific direction and a speci-

fic role that we are to be the head of the households. Each one of us carries the responsibility to see that each one of the members of our family is given everything he or she needs in order that they might be able to walk with God. I believe that many of us for years have not accepted our roles and have relied on our wives to meet our children's needs. We must change our mindset and our hearts and become convicted that in many ways our children's salvation rests upon us. Do we love our children enough to give them the precious time they need with us, or do we always have something else planned? Do we daily pray with our children in order to find out how their relationship with God is? Do we ask specific loving questions about their walk with God? "What are you reading? What have you learned? Can I help you?" Are you involved in their ministry? Do you know their friends and their lives? Do you ask the guestions. "How was your Devo? What did Roy preach on? What effect did this weekend have on you? How can I help you change?" Do our children see us reading our Bibles daily? Do they know that you are praying with your wife everyday? Do your children believe in their hearts and know in their minds you are a man of God? Do they see godly discipline in your life? God tells us He disciplines those He loves. It is so important that we discipline our children.

THE FATHER'S DISCIPLINE

The Bible tells us that God disciplines those He loves. Discipline is very important to our God. If discipline is very important to our God, should it not also be very important to us? We need to understand that it is a godly discipline that we should be teaching our children and not a worldly discipline. What is the difference? First, God disciplines in love. Our children need to see, feel and understand that our discipline with them is totally derived from the deep love we have for them and not out of anger. The world disciplines out of anger and hate, but God disciplines out of love. When we discipline our children, are we yelling or screaming and totally frustrated or are we composed, in control and ready to deal with the situation the way Jesus would? This godly discipline means giving godly direction. Are we using Scripture in our discipling? Are we calling our children to obey God and His Word first? Are we calling our children to respect us because God commands it?

God calls us to be men of His planning and His direction. He also calls us to be men who can implement His plan and His direction. I pray that we, as men of God and as fathers of God's children, will take the responsibility to love them as He loves us.

"I CAN'T AFFORD TO PAY"

A Texas friend told me of an elderly lady who came into an insurance office with a tattered life insurance policy in her hand. "I'm just going to have to turn this in," she said. "I can't afford to pay the premiums any more."

The agent looked at the policy. "But it's such a shame to turn it in now, after all these years. Isn't there someone else who could pay the premiums for you, perhaps the beneficiary?"

"Oh, I'm the beneficiary," the woman said. "My husband bought the policy. He died three years ago, and since his death it's been hard to pay the premiums."

Yes, the woman had continued paying premiums even after her husband, the insured, had died. Instead of leaving the insurance office without her policy, she left with a very large sum of money, enough to give her financial security for the rest of her life.

This story is especially touching to me, for it describes the unnecessary plight many of us find ourselves in. When Jesus died on the cross, he paid for our sins. "For Christ died for our sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring us to God..." (I Peter 3:18). Yet we often continue to work and slave as though our salvation depends entirely upon us. What good news it is to learn that the premium is already paid!

Let us accept what Jesus has done for us. It is better to spend our time worshipping and serving Him gratefully than trying to earn what is already secured.

A "LABOR" OF LOVE

As I write this, it is Labor Day, and it is an absolutely gorgeous day outside. However, as we prepare to take the family to the park, I think about what this holiday is suppose to stand for anyway.

Labor Day was instituted in honor of labor. Good ole' back-breaking, blister-causing, dirt-under-your-fingernails work. The kind that keeps you busy for hours, soaks you in sweat, and enables you to stand back at the end of a job and admire your completed task with pride. But then I pick up the newspaper and on the front page of the business section I see an article on how the above description no longer accurately describes the American work force. As I then look in the Parade magazine elsewhere in the paper, I notice an article on how the work ethic has grown to the other extreme in Japan.

In Japan, a person's work means everything to them. I mean everything! The average worker puts in $5\frac{1}{2}$ days per week, with so many hours accumulated totally for the week that the article stated that they don't even have time to spend their savings or paychecks. When asked the hypothetical question of "..what they would do if caught in an emergency and could not make it home, and could only make one phone call, who would it be to?", the overwhelming majority answered "their employer". In another article there is mention of the fact that Japanese authorities were surprised at the high number of child suicides this year as schools began. You see, Japan has the most demanding school systems in the world, and the frustration to achieve and attain goals that were unrealistic

finally drove these elementary through high school students to say "what's the use?"

I often wonder the same in the Lord's church. How many of my brothers and sisters are asking the question, "What's the use anymore?" Are many ready to commit "spiritual suicide", and perhaps I'm not even aware?

You know, legalism has been around for a long time. We are not the first people to ever experience how easy it can be to get caught up in a "works-oriented salvation". Paul addressed this problem in the book of Galatians. The message the false teachers destroyed these Galatian churches with was one of "bondage" (yoke, Gal. 5:1).

Do we have realistic goals in the Lord's church? Do we realize that our salvation is not attainable by us, but that it is a free gift that has already been given to us? (Eph. 2:8-9) Do we feel that we should have a "religious Labor Day", in honor of doing the "work of the Church"? What is the "Lord's work?" In John 6:29, Jesus says it is "...to believe in the one He (God) has sent". Sounds simple, doesn't it? But that's just it....it is! Jesus did all of the "work" on the cross, for you and me! Praise God!

When we see our "works" as redemptive, we will become frustrated and give up. because there isn't one little thing that you or I can do to make God love us anymore that He already does. But praise God when we see our "works" only as the bearing of fruit because of the way the man from Nazareth has changed us on the inside.

Can you say, "I am the Lord's servant", as Mary did? An unbroken, prideful spirit will keep us from fulfilling our potential as godly women and destroy our contentment with God's plan for our lives. We must not only recognize God's authority but joyfully obey Him, truly believing that as our creator He knows best what will make us happy.

"From the Heart of One Woman to the Heart of Other Women" (Ladies, if married, share this with your husbands.)
