Devon chaired & led opening prayer

1. Devon asked response about leadership workshop. Teachers presented good lesson and small attendance didn't affect the good done.

## Men's Meeting

June 25 1984

1. Sevon asked about frequency of men's meeting. After some discussions we decided to have general men's meeting every other month - at least tentatively.
  2. Sevon brought up the matter of long range goals particularly in regard to increasing the auditorium space. He suggested several possibilities: Increasing the size of auditorium, having double services, appointing a committee for study etc.
- Suggestion: Have regular schedule of ushers, have members set nearer to front, leaving back section open; having singing start a few minutes early for quieting the assembly down. Bill Oakley was asked to feed-up this. Other suggestion: Rope off back section. Also; assign a couple men to usher without having other assignments so they could do the best job of ushering. Bob suggested announcing the roping off of the back section ahead of time before it is done so that everyone will know and cooperate.

3. Devon suggested ~~the~~ adding on to the east end also going out to the north and squaring an addition even with the east end of bldg. Stan suggested appointing a committee to study the way to go - if and when. Stan suggested Perry lead up this committee. Some comment were given about funding for this and that the present debt be retired before going into an expansion program. Dennis Frank, Mark Craig, Phil Hostetter (Stan Palmer said he'd be moving the middle of August so couldn't) so Lois Kungel said he'd be on the committee.

4. Dean suggested VBS dates July 23-27  
No objections

5. Perry suggested ~~moving the services up~~ 1/2 hour on Sunday morning. Most felt that the time should not be moved.

6. Devon said that following a time schedule for services ~~is~~ is needed. Be brief, to the point - be conscious of time.

10. Max said that he felt there was a need for another adult Bible study class, present classes do not meet the needs. Jean to let him know when next educational committee meets.







2. Question asked about the funds for copies being used on other expenditures. Gil said the money was spent but not yet paid on last payment. Needed elsewhere.
3. Norm suggested that we go right into the main reason for the meeting - the review of past 6 months budget (expenditures). Norm handed out the 1st six months budget expenditure sheet and also a budget sheet for the next 7 months.
4. Norm said the 1st 4 months, the contributions were averaging  $59.00$  under per week. The 5th month looks to be near ~~near~~ our budget figure  $1150.00$  per week.
5. Norm reviewed the 1st 6 months, giving over the budget sheet.

- Explained Local Evangelism breakdown - showing amount of Med. Ins for both Eddy & Norm
- Nothing allocated for speakers for rest of year (April Meeting)
- Bible School - spent approx 1/2 budget thus far. With making up material (for upper classes) cost at minimum.
- Kenager Fund can be used to repair the bus so no expenditure except gas and ins is to be figured in.
- Mission - We had dropped 3 places at 1st of year - will continue our other commitments
- Insurance refund (for buses sold) was applied on our church insurance and is paid to Dept.
- Utilities - Pretty much on schedule
- Water bill is extremely high but budgeted same as last year for remaining months
- Flowers costs high - trying to lower <sup>\$125.00 for</sup> bal. of yr.
- Weekly contribution for last 5 months 1091.26/wk (assuming last contribution in May is not budgeted)

#### 6. Norm asked for questions

- a. Perry asked about paying off note \$2500.00  
Suggested it be included in the budget figures  
Norm suggested anything above the weekly figure be put toward the note payment  
Also any increase that hopefully comes because of growth can be applied.  
Mik suggested that since June has 5 Sundays that a special need toward the note be

announced to the church. and anything over the budget be applied to the note payment. Norm said that he feels that we aren't in financially straits among 100 members it really could be paid off anytime but how to do it best is the question.

7. Eddie asked if why the weekly contribution fluctuates so - some said they were paid every 2 wks and their contributions were on this basis.
8. Eddy suggested that we keep the budget figure the same and tell the congregation we are running  $59^{00}$ /wk behind. Suggestion we put a monthly report in the bulletin so all could see our progress. Bill felt that every member should have this information so that if a need is evident each can see it and respond to the need. Eddy suggested that we address ourselves to paying off specific things (copier, songbooks, this thing that thing) psychologically it would be a positive for the congregation.
9. Suggestion that we use the  $1091.26$  figures plus the weekly <sup>note payoff</sup> amount of  $94^{00}$  ( $2500^{00}$  + interest divided by 30 weeks) =  $1185^{00}$ /wk for our budget for next 7 months.

10. Jim asked if the reason of lower contribution of <sup>1984</sup> ~~was~~ because of people moving away.

Joe D said each person should set an amount that would be "as we've been prepared" our giving should be to God first (Not what is left).  
Devan said our giving averages  $9.37$  per person.  
Ed said our giving <sup>toward special requests</sup> was in excess of  $\$3500.00$  in addition to the regular contribution for the past 4 months. Also he felt that the figures of  $\$1185.00$  was well within reach.

11. Joe D. expressed thanks to both Eddy & Norm for their willingness to work with us when they could go elsewhere for more.



1. Perry Miller led prayer
2. Norm discussed the results of the meeting for the questionnaire covered <sup>of Sunday evening</sup> Aug. 2  
He related the specific number responses for each of the 4 questions:

The members who were contacted individually expressed themselves more specifically than was possible at the general meeting. The overall response of these were much the same as above.

3. Norm asked thoughts from the deacons:  
@ Joe Hughes said the increased contributions seemed to show that the people were trying to keep both men.  
@ Perry observed that the elders' contact with the members probably is a needed

thing on a regular basis. He thought perhaps more "checking" on members moving here would be better for the church.

① Norm thought that taking things for granted having 2 preachers may have worked against more involvement by the men of the congregation.

② Perry asked if we talked with Eddie about his accusative remarks <sup>in his preaching office.</sup> Norm and I met with him and suggested him not to do that. That it wasn't the encouragement the congregation needed and not good for visitors. We suggested handling problems individually.

③ Joe Cakley felt that he <sup>(Eddie)</sup> hadn't been present at the meetings or not invited. He has chosen not to come to various meetings which has led to some communication gap.

④ Dean felt Eddie was not "at ease" at social ~~events~~ events, making it hard to communicate with him even with constructive criticism.

⑤ Joe Cakley ~~the~~ said that a conflict of personality might be ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> basic problem having two preachers. This has not been conducive to the church working together.

4. Norm said that he had tried out at two other places, as an option. A complete change in the pulpit should be made, he thought. Another option would be to stay in the area and seek another job.

Another option would be for him to step back into the pulpit.

5. Discussion followed about the church being "set back" if both would leave soon. How about the transition period? Without elders and deacons the church would begin again until other men were qualified & appointed. Point given that when one elder is also ~~a~~ a preacher it's a ~~even~~ harder to make decisions without criticisms. This especially so when there are only 2 elders.

6. Observation: when 2 men were hired, all the men seemed to slack off and let the better men do the work. At least it seemed that way in retrospect.

Norm suggested that the cost of a new man would be probably 20 to 30,000/yr. Sugg: Offer what we could and work in that range.

7. Dean expressed what he would like to see: ~~It~~ he announced that both present men would be leaving but the longer range plans call for a new man. Norm would agree to stay until a transition, <sup>preacher</sup> replacement and eldership be accomplished.

8. Suggestions talked about: Men take turns preaching, etc. until mortgage is substantially reduced. Eddie <sup>living</sup> ~~remaining~~ in the house and starting a new work near Legonier.

Norm - Chairman

1. Joe Pabley led opening prayer.
2. Minutes read of previous meeting.
3. Norm explained that the loan was set up for \$5,000<sup>00</sup>, however we pay interest on just the amount we need and use.
4. Norm said the heating contractor was going to replace convert one furnace to gas in Dec., the other two in January.
5. Joe Pabley replaced several bulbs around the building. One needed on rd sign at highway. Have looking for one to replace present bulb.
6. Perry reported that the contractor for entrance doors has not contacted us on costs. Perry drew on chalkboard the ideas for the west as well as the south entry.
7. Discussion <sup>followed</sup> for gutting and taking care of the water problem in back of the south wing.
8. Norm started discussion about the selection of elders. Since less than half of our members turned in any names, the elders contacted most all the others. All now received, brother Joe Pabley received by far the most, the next two names were Perry Miller and Bob May, next two Fred Pabley and Joe Hughes. About six

said "None were qualified." As the figures now show, it appears that the congregation did not give a clear mandate on any man (especially beyond Joe Pakley). On the basis of the info. received, it would seem to indicate that the congregation may not feel ~~that~~ much in agreement about appointment. Bro. Joe Pakley said he didn't feel that he was ready <sup>to</sup> serve as an elder at this time.

9. The matter was brought up about Eddie leaving. The minutes were read where the congregation is committed to Eddie for 2 yrs. He additionally asked that his benefits continue to the end of the year (or if possible until March <sup>1987</sup>). It was felt however that we should set a termination date for Eddie by the 1<sup>st</sup> of the year, for his full support ~~for~~ and until Mar 1<sup>st</sup> 1987 for his benefits. A letter will be sent or given to him outlining this plan.

10. Discussion again about the eldership. After much discussion it was thought best to meet with the men and present the findings and alternatives. Perry expressed the thought that the congregation would be "let down" if eldership selection does not transpire. Dean pointed out the lower percentage for the men mentioned was not a clear mandate for the leadership <sup>appointment</sup>.

10. continued below:

Norm expressed the thought that he wants to change, and <sup>give it his best and</sup> be an inspiration for the time he's here, so that when he leaves, a new man can come into ~~an~~ ~~opening work~~ a work which would be on the upswing and growing.

11. Dean announced a need for the Dove School family. Joe Pakley has some money, however it was suggested to him that Sherri Courtney needed help also. Joe is to find out more about this Wednesday evening.

10. Norm stated that the <sup>men</sup> mentioned most often (except Bob May) were presently deacons, which would indicate the congregation's recognition of the deacons leadership already. He suggested a commitment to closer communications among the elders and deacons, <sup>with</sup> regular meetings, so that a more unified program of work could be planned in lieu of further eldership appointment at this time. This, too, can be covered in men's meeting, as an option.

Bro. Joe Pakly turned down the appointment saying he didn't feel qualified.

We met with the deacons and shared this info, with them last Monday evening.

We suggested to them:

Without a clear cut mandate from the church, perhaps we should work more closely with them to better the communications for better functioning of the body as well as giving deacons more experience & training for future selection of elders.

Mike Hall suggested that meetings every other month was OK, for all the men.

Joe Gervic suggested meetings every month

with further preparations for training the deacons.

Norm suggested meetings more often that would be shorter in duration, with the deacons.

Bill Pepito said it appears to him on the basis of the info that perhaps we are not ready to appoint new men. He suggested a strong development program for other men coming along.

Mike asked "How many were we wanting to place in the Eldership?"

He thought that the initial response was for general info. Then the highest would be further considered.

Perry said Norm's name was handled differently. His name was suggested with the congregation being allowed to object on scriptural grounds.

Norm's idea was to sift out the men ~~with~~ <sup>among</sup> all the men who are qualified to serve, not necessarily putting a limit on the number appointed.

Jim Piratt <sup>do</sup> We know who has the desire for <sup>subring?</sup>

Bill Pepito asked if the other men were approached and if the results were talked over with the deacons. We did ~~mention~~ <sup>relate</sup> to the deacons that all their names were among the highest 6. Perry Miller said the best interest of the church was suggestive of eldership. Other wise he thought that the eldership should be dissolved at this time, and the new preacher should be given the leadership role.

Joe Hughes asked why a preacher (as Perry suggested) should have the leadership instead of any one else.

~~Jim~~ Piratt asked about 6 months from now. Appoint them? Norm sensed a time of a "low" right now and that hopefully another 6 months would make a difference.

Kevin May does not think the eldership should be dissolved at this time.

Gene Sowles expressed that we weren't after dissolving but replacing Norm as Elder.

Joe Oakley expressed the reasons why he feels

he is not presently qualified. He knows with his family responsibility he doesn't feel he can do that or find the time. Also, he expressed his thoughts as to the duties of the elders - as shepherds. It appeared to him that the men were not supportive of present programs (Singing, Bible Drill, etc.) Jim Piratt said he felt with Norm leaving that we ought to start looking for a minister even now.

Chris Kiesler's letter was read.

Points covered:

1. Consider Norm as having left. Start looking.
2. Eddie he paid thru Dec. but then discontinuing his services as of Dec 15th.

Joe Daley suggested we ought to take care of ourselves first instead of Eddie first, even to the point of discontinuing his support if church here needs to.

Bob May suggested polling the church again to double check on their selection just considering men whose names were submitted.

Bill Pipito asked how the early church made selection. Norm referred to Acts 6

The congregation selected and the agents appointed. This held true with ~~the~~ Titus also appointing elders (but still the local church made selection probably)

Bill felt that the other names <sup>(men)</sup> should be approached, as to their gratification and desire for the eldership.

Joe Hughes remembered that Carl Gieske made recommendations of Sean Foggatt and Devon Foetter and asked the congregation to voice objections to their selection.


