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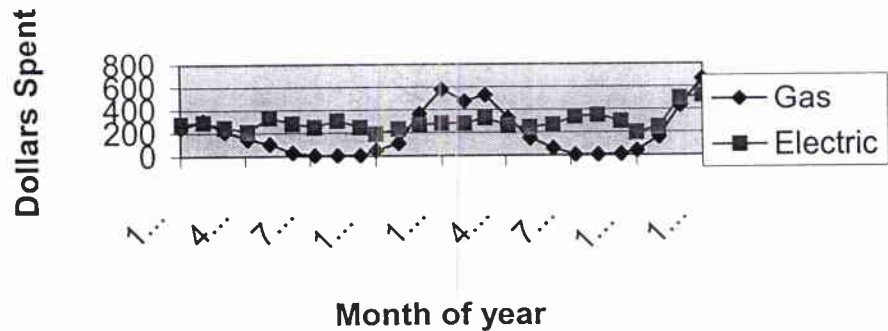


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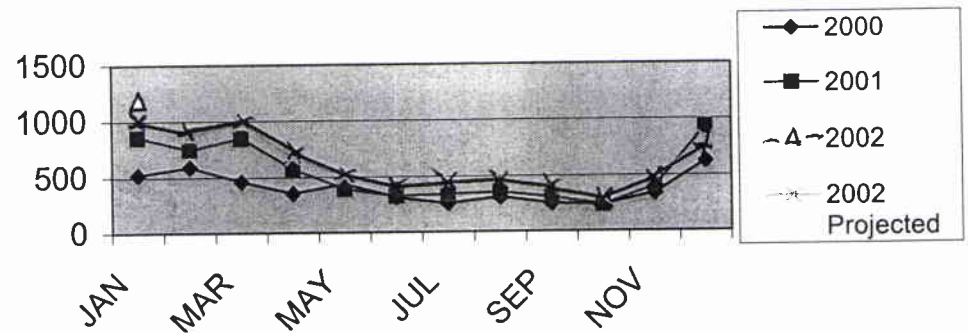
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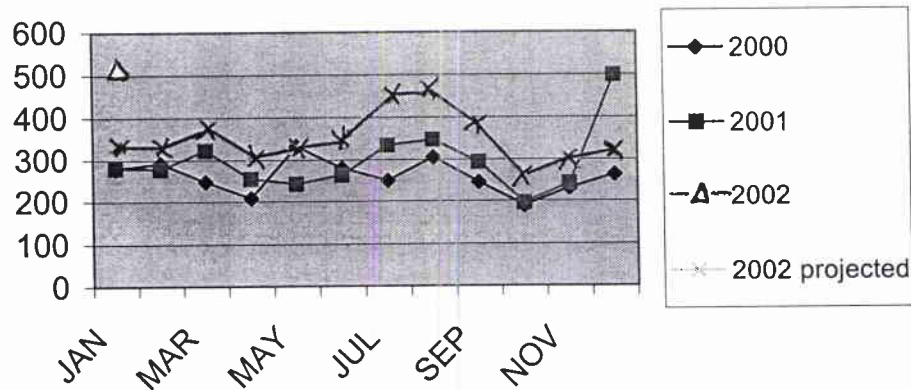
Utilities 2 Year Actuals



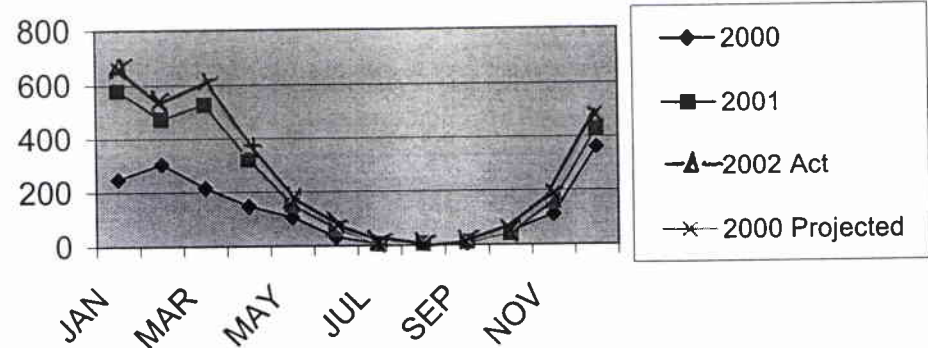
2 year comparison of Utility costs

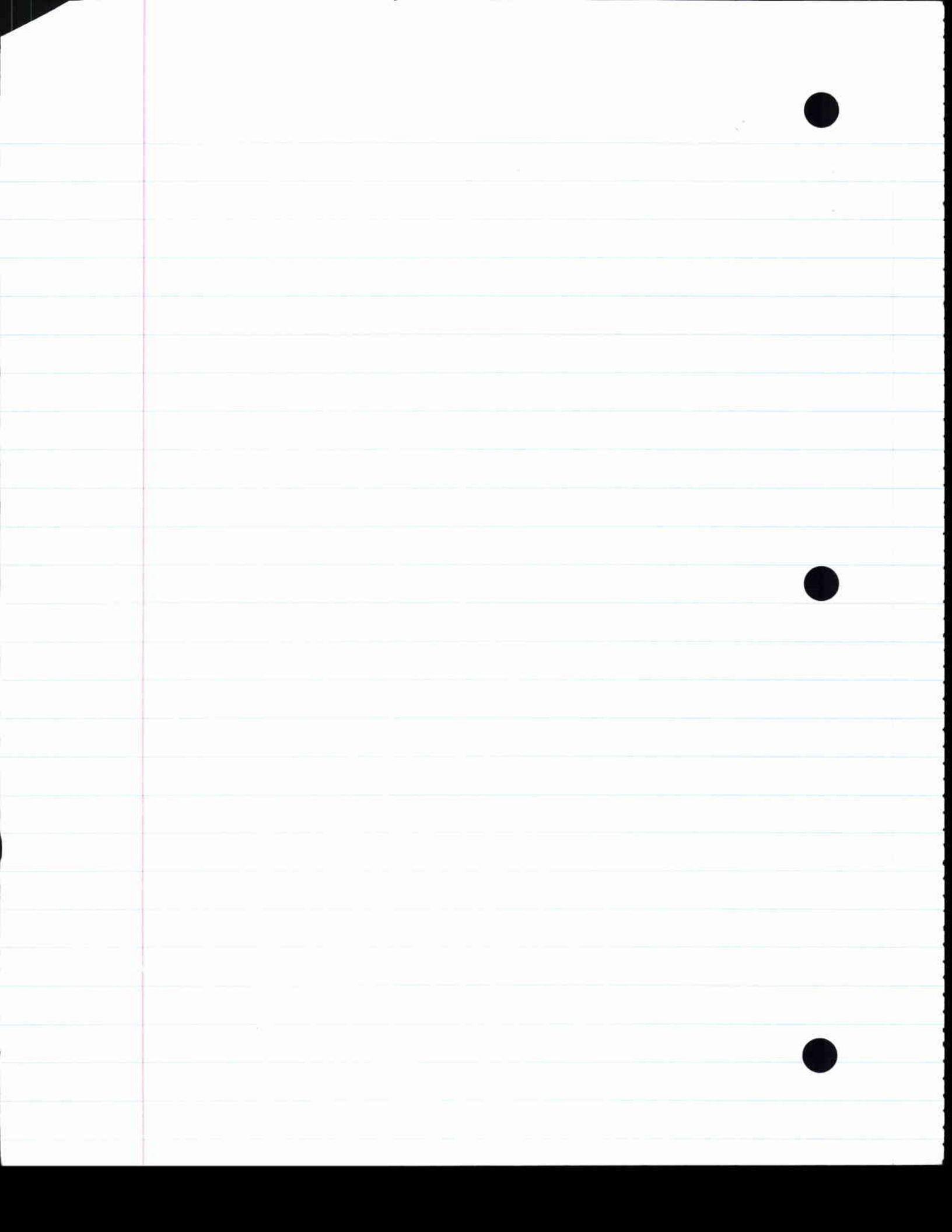

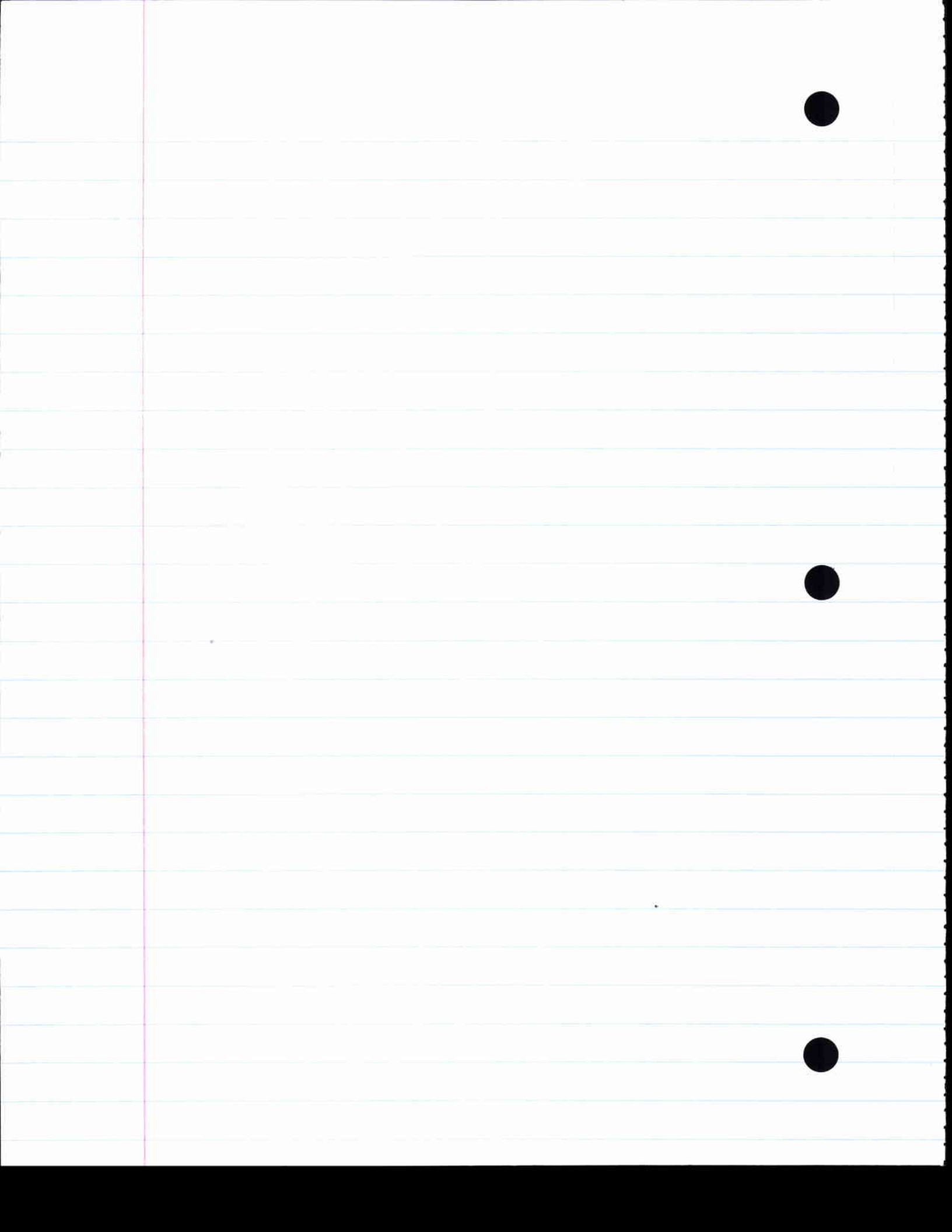

These Bible study classes are open for Men and women but required a commitment to the class. Classes include videos and homework. At Kentucky they had 2 classes scheduled for Tues & Thursday. If you missed on day you could pick it up on the other night. Need an Administrator or facilitator to keep the study focused on the material. At Glasgow there are 2008 congregations that could benefit from the school.

Classes: 30-35 minutes of video followed by discussion for the remainder of class with the expectation that the students have done their home work. Typically 12 lessons/study.

* These studies are designed to ground young men & women in the word of God.

Questions to consider: Is there interest here at Lagrange?

Would students make the required commitment?

Bill - there are 32 courses for level 3 for grades & certificate at level 2 - 28 courses; different tests level 1 - audit the class. View videos; not responsible to Sunset for memorizing scripture submitting reports & sunset for grading.

Currently one individual has invested in the videos.

Bill - for level 2 the first class had \$29 cost for workbook and books for the first class. ~~the~~ Brian, Bill, and Jim Piratt are starting this study and are ~~are~~ setting up 1 night per week.

Key need: Facilitator for running this program as a satellite school.

F Finance: Not all January entries are in the computer. New budget is not finalized.

1984 - Preliminary budget is being prepared based on 1983. Elders have reviewed. Perry commented on some of the changes.

Last year income was just over \$6,000

Benevolence allocations were shifted and increased \$375/yr.

We are paying him straight \$275/wk even during these weeks that he requested off for Sunday evenings to talk to congregations about Duchwood Hills camp. B.J. Susic is speaking this evening & Brian H. next Sun. Eve.
4. Brian H. said that the "children's worship" is in need of teachers. He & Julie are scheduled for July, and no one offered to take it in Aug (without remaining couples taking it more than twice a year - which they agreed they should not do. The program may have to stop for awhile if no volunteers come forward.
